Snodland	From Cllr Anne Maloney Need to extend the zone to include the new development at Holborough and Holborough Park.  From Snodland Town Council Include the Land between St. Benedicts Road and the Lake (bordering Lafarge Land), Holborough Park and the new Holborough development and Brookland Lake.	Including these additional areas in the zone would be beneficial, especially the new Holborough development, in order to ensure that anti-social drinking does not occur.
Leybourne	From PCSO Rob Sayer Zone to also include  The field surrounded by Baywell, Grassmere and Copsehill (the one where the camera is going!)  The field to the north side of Willowmead  The recreation area (ball park) on Oxley Shaw Lane  The wooded area to the south of the Old Rectory Pub  The footpath route along Rectory Lane North, through Baywell, to Lunsford Lane.  The footpath from the Baywell field to Woodlead	Including these additional areas in the zone would be beneficial, as local knowledge as has identified these areas as potential places for anti-social drinking.
	From Leybourne Parish Council Wish for the zone to cover the whole parish.	As the Parish covers a large area, it would not be feasible to cover the whole area. However, the zone will be amended to reflect the areas suggested above.
	From John Gaunt and Partners solicitors No objections to zone on the basis that the zone does not cover land belonging to the pub (Castle Lake)	The alcohol control zone would not cover land belonging to licensed premises, as it only applies to public open spaces.

Platt	From Platt Parish Council Are broadly in favour of the proposal but should also consider:	Including these additional areas in the zone would be beneficial, as local knowledge as has identified these areas as potential places for anti-social drinking.
	Platt Woods, Stonehouse Field allotments and the allotments field, the area south of the railway line between Platt industrial estate and King George's Field	
Wrotham	From Parish Council Fully support the proposal. However, would like to also consider: The end of Old London Road at the commencement of the footbridge that crosses the M20 to the A20. (Include the whole of Old London Road up to and including the footbridge over the M20).	Including this additional area in the zone would be beneficial as local knowledge as has identified this area as a potential place for anti-social drinking.
Borough Green	From Philip Herbert (resident) Consider including the open spaces between the Woodlands estate and Quarry Hill Road (i.e. the road leading to Basted House and the grounds of the medical centre).	Including these additional areas in the zone would be beneficial as local knowledge as has identified these areas as potential places for anti-social drinking
West Malling	From PCSO Ed Moore Wonders whether the scheme may only need to be put in place along the high street.	A zone covering a limited area may cause displacement to other areas not included within the zone. A zone covering the whole of the town centre area is therefore preferred as this will avoid the need to reapply to extend the zone at a later date should displacement problems arise.
	From West Malling Parish Council: Members feel strongly that no case has been established for the need for an Alcohol Control Zone.	Kent Police are fully supportive of the proposed zone for West Malling and provided supporting information as to the need for a zone to the CDAB on 25 July 2007. This information stated that the police had received a number of complaints from local residents and felt that the introduction

		of the zone would enhance their powers to deal with such issues. They also felt that the proposed zone would boost the confidence of the Pub Watch scheme.
	Concerned that the zone will stigmatise the area and give the impression of an area with 'problems'.	The aim of the zone is to provide reassurance to the public, as it shows that the Police and Borough Council are working to make their area an even safer place to visit.
	Concerned with additional signage.	The number of signs erected would be kept to a minimum.
	Members see no reason for virtually the whole of the Parish to be included.	See answer above to PCSO comments.
Tonbridge	No responses received	We confirm that the zone should cover the area proposed in the original submission.
