OLDER PERSONS ISSUES - SCOPE OF THE BOARD AND BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The report of the Chief Executive set out the scope of the work to be addressed by the Older Persons Issues Advisory Board and provided background information on older people in the Borough. Reference was made to the adopted Kent Policy Framework for Later Life together with a schedule of services provided by the Borough Council These stretched across a broad range of for older people. responsibilities including housing services, planning, community development and community safety and indoor and outdoor leisure.

Presentations were received from David Jessop of the Royal British Legion, Barry Lock from Tonbridge Baptist Church, Keith Austin of Age Concern Malling and Tina Sterling from the Alzheimer's Society. Each speaker gave details of the services provided by their organisation and a number of common themes emerged including the need to address social isolation, the concerns of carers, provision of transport and ensuring external funding and resources were appropriately directed.

During discussion the following specific issues were identified for future

consideration by the Board:

- 1. Consider the delivery of relevant actions set out in the Sustainable Community Strategy community hub service model and formation of an Older People's Forum.
- 2. Focus on issues involving older people with care and support needs and separately give consideration to the needs of active older people.
- 3. Address cross-cutting issues affecting all older people, for example debt issues, access to services and advice.
- 4. Explore with partners the scope to develop innovation in service delivery for older people through new partnership working.
- 5. Reach out to socially isolated older people, identifying their needs and overcoming their reluctance to involvement with support services.
- 6. Promote opportunities for inter-generational activities to break down the barriers and misconceptions between the young and old.
- 7. Address the needs of carers of older people, the challenges faced and what support funding should be made available to assist them.
- 8. Investigate issues of resources and funding to assist older people, for example Attendance Allowance and Disability Living Allowance claims issues.

It was suggested that the Borough Council should work with the Tonbridge and Malling Local Strategic Partnership in pursuing the issues affecting older people and thus act as a catalyst for local partnership working and innovation. In the meantime, appropriate visits would be arranged for members of the Advisory Board and Cabinet to inform the way forward.
