## 1 <u>COMMUNITY SAFETY PARTNERSHIP DRAFT ACTION PLAN</u>

To endorse the draft Community Safety Partnership Action Plan for 2012/13

## 1.1 Background

- 1.1.1 Each year the Community Safety Partnership must prepare and publish an annual action plan which sets out the priorities which the Partnership will address throughout the coming year.
- 1.1.2 The Partnership is able to agree its priorities through using the Strategic Assessment to pick out key areas of concern. The Strategic Assessment was produced in September 2011 and used data from a variety of sources to analyse key issues for the borough. Community consultation was also used to consider areas of concern to the public.
- 1.1.3 During February 2012 the Partnership held an 'away day' where the Strategic Assessment was discussed and the priority areas confirmed. During 2012/13 the Partnership will address the key issues of anti-social behaviour, domestic abuse and substance misuse (drugs and alcohol).

### 1.2 Draft Action Plan 2012/13

- 1.2.1 The draft Action Plan for 2012/13 is attached at Annex 1. It should be noted that there are some aspects that need to be finalised with Partners and therefore this is not a completed version.
- 1.2.2 A completed version of the plan will be circulated to Partnership during April for ratification.
