THE KENT COUNTY COUNCIL (VARIOUS ROADS, TONBRIDGE AND MALLING) (WAITING RESTRICTIONS AND ON-STREET PARKING PLACES) (AMENDMENT 2) ORDER 2011. Eccles: Mackenders Lane and Skinners Close.

We are responding to the parking proposals referenced above.

The parking proposals are described as "New parking restrictions to prevent obstruction and to improve visibility". However the proposals are cross referenced to Phase 6B where the statement of reasons asserts that "The proposals should improve visibility for vehicles entering and exiting Skinners Close." There is no mention in Phase 6B of obstruction (or ease of access). The reason for raising this discrepancy is because in recent times the pattern of residents' parking and behaviour has generally been good with one the exception. The exception is that residents from one household have taken to parking a number of cars fully on the tarmac pavement area at the southern corner of the intersection of Skinners Close with Mackenders Lane. This inconsiderate parking does cause some visibility problems for traffic emerging from Skinners Close. Because the tarmac area is so wide, it is not clear whether vehicles parking away from the kerb would come under the remit of TMBC Civil Enforcement Officers, even if yellow lines were introduced. Without enforcement measures, it is unlikely that the introduction of yellow lines would deter these people from parking on the pavement. It should be noted that the Council recently conducted an informal consultation where the visibility concerns were made clear to residents but this did not reduce pavement parking.

With regard to parking in the road itself, you might recall that there has been a previous consultation on parking restrictions. It was accepted then that any parking infringements were infrequent and transitory and it was decided not to introduce yellow lines. Since then the standard of parking in the road (as opposed to fully on the pavement) has if anything improved.

We reiterate below our previous objections to the introduction of double yellow lines to regulate parking in the road as follows.

It should be acknowledged that Mackenders Lane is not a through road and therefore there is a finite movement of traffic. Varying in width along its length and with limited pavements, both vehicles and pedestrians have successfully taken a pragmatic view to using the space, similar to that of the shared space experiment in Ashford town centre which recently reported a 41% reduction in accidents by the abolition of visible traffic regulations. We have lived opposite the junction for thirty years and we are not aware of any accident or near miss at the junction. We are concerned that the introduction of yellow lines at this location will give implicit permission for inconsiderate parking elsewhere in Mackenders Lane.

We can categorically state that the introduction of yellow lines at the junction of Mackenders Lane and Bull Lane has had a contrary effect on safety and has greatly decreased the visibility for traffic emerging from Mackenders Lane. Before the introduction of the yellow lines in this location, people took a sensible attitude to parking, but they now park at the immediate limits of the yellow lines and vehicles now regularly park directly opposite the junction itself. We are concerned that to arbitrarily introduce new yellow lines as proposed at Skinners Close will not solve any visibility problem, but may well create a further safety issue, as described above, as well as urbanising a country lane.

If yellow lines were to be introduced then the proposed extent of the lines up Skinners Close is excessive. Cars always park single file on the southern side of the road so cars exiting the Close do not have to manoeuvre around parked cars. The limit of visibility for a car exiting the Close is already determined by fencing and a hedge on the Southern side. If the proposed yellow lines on the Southern side of the Close were reduced by one car length, there would be no additional impact on visibility. The splayed entrance to Skinners Close allows good room for a vehicle entering the Close to pass, manoeuvre or to temporarily wait for an approaching vehicle to exit. From experience, the splayed entrance to the Close is more accommodating for both visibility and manoeuvrability than a junction which does not splay.



am writing with reference to your letter of 13 December regarding parking restriction proposals in Fernbank Close.

We are not in favour of the plans outlined in your proposal. The problem with commuter parking is so small - on occasions one car parks there all day and we feel that the inconvenience putting parking restrictions in place for guests of residents in the close is far greater than having one car parked all day. The busiest time for people parking in the close is actually on the school runs and your proposal won't deter people from continuing to do that. In addition to us not believing that it is necessary we also believe that putting yellow road markings and accompanying signage in the close will demean the look of the close. It is a pretty, country close where town like parking restrictions and road markings will not fit the look of the close. We chose to live here as the close is full of unique houses, lovely gardens and a quiet road without invasive signage and road markings and we will be most upset if this were to change. We believe that the proposal is an unnecessary spend of the council budget and of course to make it worthwhile an additional cost of someone to enforce the restriction would need to be provisioned for incurring further ongoing costs. We think that money could be spent in better ways in other areas such as putting a speed camera on the main Fossington Way where drivers regularly drive at way over the 30 mile an hour speed limit putting children and pedestrians at risk every day.

We really hope that our comments are taken into account and you reconsider your planned proposals.

Thank you for your further communication dated 13th December which refers to drawing number DD-562-06. Your proposal to paint double yellow lines at the entrance to Fernbank Close is warranted, as it will prevent the hazard of parked commuter cars on this potentially dangerous corner.

The second part of the proposal, the 'No waiting 11.30 am until noon', is unwelcome. It appears to be your intention to include the existing car parking bay at the hammerhead turning at the end of Fernbank within this no waiting period. Why? The occasional nuisance of commuter parking – the maximum number of 'strange' cars left during a working day that I have witnessed being four in number – is not large; the countermeasures seem to me to be disproportionate.





I am fully in support of the proposed additional restrictions but consider that they are overlooking an important safety aspect.

The current free parking arrangements result in vehicles being parked at the top end of the Close near the junction with Fostington Way. Due to the bend in the road these vehicles are not always visible when turning in from the main road until the last moment. I am sure residents are aware of the danger and approach with extra care. Visitors might easily be caught short, necessitating avoiding action and the resultant additional dangers to other road users.

The proposed extent of the 'double yellow' restriction would still leave parking allowable in an area which is not immediately visible on turning into the close. I would strongly suggest that the total restriction area be extended by up to 10 metres beyond the current proposal to remove this hazard.

With refference to the above notice concerning parking restrictions at the junction of Bell Lane & Furnleigh Rise.

I have no objections to parking restrictions what so ever. However, my concerns are of the actual policing of the restrictions and that double yellow lines will only be effective if the people who feel the need to park there take any notice of them. Should visual restrictions, double yellow lines in this case, be employed to deter motorists from parking in the proposed area then why does it not work at the top of Bell Lane outside of A & D Fisheries. Where, On a main road junction, it is regular to see vehicles parked on the kerb over yellow line causing congestion and a possible accident situation. The vehicles that park on the yellow lines outside A & D Fisheries are not just your average motorists but include Police vehicles, with the policeman getting fish and chips,(A & D do do nice fish and chips) BT Vehicles, Council vans. I know that A & D Fisheries have done as much improving as possible to alleviate the parking problem at the main road junction and no more could be asked of them. But how can the introduction of yellow lines at the juction of Bell Lane & Fernleigh rise be policed if at the top of the road, at a main road junction, even the authorities abuse the law. I'm not normally one to speak out and I am, as I mentioned earlier, not opposed to the parking restrictions but I feel that the problem would be better resolved if a more physical barrier was positioned to physically stop people parking there cars on the corner junction of Bell Lane & Fernleigh Rise. Perhaps the large metal bell shaped bollards would create an effective deterant. I also feel that having the vellow lines as proposed would encourage certain motorists that reside within the area in question to park on the grass verge also around the area in question. An example of parking on the verge in Fernleigh Rise has already been set at the lower juction of Bell Lane & Fernleigh Rise where there has not been a proposal for yellow lines.

I think I am being "Devils Advocate" but would be interested in your reasoning for the proposal of yellows lines and how the area is going to be policed for the expense to be justified where as a physical barrier would just stop it.

This communication is just conversational only and does not intend to delay any work or decissions that may be intended to address the parking problem at the proposed junction.

I refer to your letter of 13 December relating to this Order.

When the changes to parking restrictions in the Street were made some years ago, the length of road where parking was permitted was extended by one or two bays. This had the unforeseen effect of blocking the sight line when exiting the driveway from our house on to the Street. When the bays are occupied it is not possible to see traffic coming from the right. We have had two accidents because of this, fortunately relatively minor, but it is only a matter of time before there is a major collision. There is a bus stop immediately opposite the drive used by school children and others so that a collision could have very serious consequences indeed.

I have no objection to permitting parking in the Street and to removing the time restriction so long as the number of permitted bays is reduced to restore the sight line.

Thank you for your letter dated 13th December 2012 and enclosed drawing number DD-562-13 Rev A concerning the above subject.

Kent Police have no specific observations to make regarding this proposal, however in general terms we would expect the following:

- The application meets the necessary criteria.
- The introduction of prohibition of waiting complies in all respect with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
- If being used for 'corner protection' the prohibition of waiting restriction is for a 24-hour period and extends for a distance of at least 10 metres from any junction. Thus preventing vehicles mistakenly parking during the hours of darkness and contravening provisions of the Roads Vehicles Lighting Regulations 1994.
- The introduction of such measures will not leave the Police with the task of carrying out constant enforcement issues such as obstruction by transferring the problem to other areas.
- The safety of other road users is not compromised by the introduction of these measures.

Civil Parking Enforcement will require your Authority to ensure resources are available to enforce this proposal.


On the plan you can see that we ask for the parking restrictions to be extended to cover the exit from Southey Way on the south side of Chaucer Way. You will see from the photo attached that vehicles do park in this position at present. When this happens it necessitates vehicles exiting Southey Way towards Gighill Road to be on the right-hand side of the road facing oncoming traffic from Gighill Road some of which enter Chaucer Way from the north and are very quickly at the junction with Southey Way. We note that cars exiting from Priestley Drive and Macaulay Close do not have this problem as these exits are facing double yellow lines in Chaucer Way.

With the proposed parking restrictions, of which we approve, the risk of the exit from Southey Way being hazardous, due to parked vehicles opposite, will increase considerably.







Thank you for your letter dated 13th December 2012 regarding the above subject. We are writing to you regarding the proposed new parking restrictions in the area of Laburnum Drive, Maple Close and New Hythe Lane.

You stated in your letter that there had been an initial consultation and that the council had written to residents requesting their views. We did not receive any correspondence in relation to this consultation and we have asked several of our neighbours, and they were not consulted either. Therefore we feel that we were denied the opportunity to comment on your proposals at an early stage in the process.

(

We have two areas of concern with these proposals:

1. The proposal to install double yellow lines in Laburnum Drive and Maple Close, up to the junction with Pine Close.

We agree with the proposal to introduce corner protection in order to assist visibility when exiting Maple Close into Laburnum Drive, and to allow the free flow of traffic to the junction with New Hythe Lane. However, we would object to the proposal to extend the double yellow lines in Maple Close up to the junction with Pine close as this will lead to the displacement of vehicles that currently park in this area, which may cause obstruction issues and inappropriate parking elsewhere in Maple Close, Laburnum Drive and other nearby roads.

 In our opinion (and this includes some of the other local residents) an opportunity has been missed with this proposal to address road safety issues in New Hythe Lane, in the area showing the existing parking restrictions (coloured red) on drawing number DD-562-14 that you provided.

New Hythe Lane is an unclassified road but the traffic flows are possibly higher than some 'B' class roads in the area. This is due to the road being a through route to Larkfield Parish Council offices, several industrial estates, the Tesco Extra superstore in Leybourne Way, Holy Trinity Church, village hall and associated playing fields, Larkfield Leisure Centre, New Hythe Rail station and numerous residential housing developments some of which have been built in the last ten or fifteen years.

New Hythe Lane is also a regularly used bus route in both directions, the main fire station is located on the corner of Kingfisher Road junction, and it is also used as a link road by traffic between the A20 and the A228/M20 junction 4, to avoid the longer route via several signalised junctions along the A20/A228 by-pass. So we find it bizarre that this section of New Hythe Lane, which is arguably the narrowest section, is not being considered for new parking restrictions.

The area in question is between number 53 and the Kent Fire & Rescue station, where there are two sections on the west side of New Hythe Lane, with gaps in the double yellow lines and no parking restrictions.

We are aware that some of the properties on this side of New Hythe Lane have no off-street parking, however it is our view that some of the vehicles parked in this section are not always local residents parking here. We believe that by allowing any vehicles to park here it is not only the cause of unnecessary congestion but it also compromises road safety.

If one vehicle is parked in this area it causes an obstruction in the highway resulting in congestion to such an extent that north bound traffic frequently tails back as far as the A20 junction. This is obviously exacerbated at peak times and the queues and frustration caused by this results in drivers carrying out unsafe manoeuvres. To give some examples:

- South bound drivers are often seen to speed up to prevent opposing drivers from moving out and manoeuvring round the parked vehicles, they visibly increase their speed and regularly exceed the posted 30mph speed limit.
- Drivers will often do this even when north bound vehicles are passing parked vehicles.
- North bound drivers will often move out to overtake the parked vehicles when there is oncoming traffic and it is clearly not safe to do so.
- The buses that use the route are often seen waiting to pass the parked vehicles, but opposing drivers regularly fail to give way to them.
- It is usually difficult to enter New Hythe Lane from Laburnum Drive, mainly due to the parked vehicles and traffic manoeuvring passed them in both directions.
- These incidents are a daily occurrence and we have witnessed these manoeuvres many times, in the past one of us has witnessed crashes occur at this location. We have also seen damage to some of the parked vehicles, which may have been caused by passing traffic.

The only time that this section of road operates smoothly is when there are no vehicles parked there, or when traffic flows are at their lowest during the night.

It has also been bought to our attention that there is to be further development to the north of Larkfield near the Aylesford Newsprint site. If these plans are realised

then there will be even more traffic on New Hythe Lane, which will compound the issues further.

In conclusion, we would recommend the following:

- 1. In Maple Close the proposed double yellow lines extend north only for the purpose of providing corner protection for the junction.
- 2. That the council undertakes a further consultation with relevant organisations and local residents to extend the existing double yellow lines in New Hythe Lane, restricting parking on the west side of the road, thereby closing the two gaps in the double yellow lines. We appreciate that residents who live on the west side of the road may not have access to off-street parking, so we would suggest that there are also proposals for alternative parking. For instance there is a wide area of grass verge between New Hythe Lane and Briar Close and it may be possible to convert part of the southern section of this verge to several parking spaces. These could be for the exclusive use by the vehicles of residents in New Hythe Lane as residents on the 'Tree estate' have off-street parking.

It is our view that these measures would improve the safety of all road users in the area and assist in the free flow of traffic.

In reply to your letter dated 13th December 2012.

Overwhelmingly there is considerable concern regarding Tonbridge & Malling Council plans to add further restrictions to Laburnum Drive and Maple Close.

The root of the problem lies in New Hythe Lane, caused by the parking of the resident's on the West side of the road.

Extending the double yellow lines down into Maple Close and further along Laburnum Drive would only achieve in moving more cars and commercial vehicles onto those residents that already experience the parking problems.

The junction of New Hythe Lane with laburnum Drive has become a pinch point (solely due to the parked cars) on a road that was never meant to have carried the volume of traffic or indeed the size of the vehicles which it is now expected to take.

Constant redevelopment of the area has seen this road clog up morning, evening and partially during the day, backing traffic up onto the A20 London Road. This can only get worse with more development having been passed/proposed and ever increasing road traffic use.

Clearly, until this pinch point has been solved then looking at other alternatives, i.e. double yellow lines, is really a cheap and very short term exercise. This will have little influence on the wider ever increasing problem, which is that New Hythe Lane is in desperate need to have a good constant two way traffic flow at all times.

Our view is that the Council needs to be considering two options:

Firstly, cutting back and getting rid of the pavement on the West side of New Hythe Lane, effectively creating a narrow lay-by which would probably be enough to give the clearance for a two-way flow of traffic.

Secondly, looking to convert the area at the back of the houses where the seemingly under used garages are located, thus creating a parking area, a combination of both might be worth thinking about.

One other option of this pinch point is that traffic uses Bell Lane, Oak Drive, Maple Close and Laburnum Drive as a rat-run, as turning into New Hythe Lane heading North from the A20 is on many occasions a slow process.

The consensus is that by proposing to extend the yellow lines will inevitably lead to increased tension and more disputes.







You are completely missing the point. Hilltop parking is a nightmare, throughout the entire road and all roads attached to it.

Your proposals are dealing with less than 30% of the Hilltop parking and road use problems created by the college students parking here.

In fact you are enraging residents because you are depriving them of any nearby on-road parking during the day. Residents need access to their nearby parking, not the inability to use it during the day.

The Hilltop area needs to be entirely turned over to proper residents permit parking with double yellow lines in all other places.

For clarity and as a reminder, I will repeat my comments in previous emails.

Your assumption that this plan would significantly reduce the parking in the Hill Top area as you have stated is simply not the case. 

You asked for my views on this planning proposal in your letter of 13 December. I commented on the main issue - to extend the parking restriction to weekday afternoons - in my email of 21 August 2011 Nothing has changed so I repeat that, for the record, below. I recognise that opinion of residents in these roads is now in favour of change. If the change is approved and implemented and there is a significant knock-on effect to parking in The Drive, as I anticipate, I would expect The Drive Residents Association (which I chair) to want to invite residents to consider asking TMBC to introduce a similar restriction in The Drive. I take it that an approach would be considered sympathetically in the light of this proposal.

You asked for comments on these proposals. As a resident in The Drive, close to the corner of Springwell Road, <u>I object</u> to any proposals which would make parking more difficult in neighbouring roads. I do not understand the sentence in the consultation letter which says that the proposal to extend restrictions to include an afternoon period would ensure that "...there is no differential to neighbouring roads". But that is precisely what would happen as The Drive has a morning restriction only.

I am not clear why these proposals are being put forward so soon after the Council ruled out any changes across Zone M after a wide consultation which concluded "...there was poor support across the neighbourhood for any additional parking restriction and [the Joint Transportation Board] resolved that the current arrangements should remain unchanged (letter of 7 Oct 2011 from Mike McCulloch, your ref PES/MMC/P3/Zone M)". The principle applied than was that as there was insufficient support across Zone M there would be no change but now you seem to be saying that the residents of any road that want a change can seek to have that enforced without the need for a zone-wide consultation. And why seek to extend the restriction to Saturdays? That proposal was never even included in last year's consultation."



Re Amendments to the Parking Restrictions in South Tonbridge Your Ref –P4/24-6bForm-36

I am delighted that the changes proposed by residents are now going forward and support the principle of increasing the residents' only parking arrangements. These changes will help to mitigate the increasing pressure on increasingly limited parking spaces in our road, Woodfield, and surrounding roads.

There is one small aspect that I am opposed to and that is the addition of a double yellow line outside houses 27A and 29 in Woodfield Road.

My objection is based on three points :

1 This addition to the plan was not offered for fuller consultation by residents at any stage. I assume it was added in after a specific request by one or two residents (one assumes of numbers 27A and 29). Nobody else had a chance to consider or comment upon the addition of further double lines during the informal consultation. And alternative views were therefore not sought.

2 Adding double yellow lines at this point is quite unnecessary. The single white line is quite sufficient. Cars parked across this entrance is a very rare event indeed and I can in fact think of no instance of it happening in all the 25 years I have lived here. Places where delivery vans etc can pull up for very short periods of time are at a premium in the road and one of the few spaces is outside numbers 27 and 29. This can be done without blocking the entrance to number 27A. My wife and I are often forced to do this when off-load shopping from our car, when all the parking spaces are occupied and we need to park elsewhere. Adding double yellow lines would create considerable further inconvenience for the marginal benefit of perhaps two households. I would also add that there is a rare gem of a space directly outside number 27, which currently has no markings at all yet is small enough to accommodate very short term stops by small cars and is actively used by several families for off-loading. This small space adds enormous flexibility to the street for residents use and presumably would be lost if double yellow lines were installed.

3 Yellow lines are unsightly. Woodfield Road suffers from a growing number of signs and instruction to motorists and pedestrians alike. It still maintains an air of its

original Edwardian charm, increasing blighted by cars and car paraphernalia. Please do not add any more yellow lines particularly when the rationale seems so dubious.

I am grateful to you and the Council for your patience in responding to this long quest from residents and hope that my comments will be heeded.

Thank you for your letter dated 13th December 2012 and enclosed drawing number DD-562-26 Rev A concerning the above subject.

Kent Police have no specific observations to make regarding this proposal, however in general terms we would expect the following:

- The application meets the necessary criteria.
- The introduction of prohibition of waiting complies in all respect with the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002.
- If being used for 'corner protection' the prohibition of waiting restriction is for a 24-hour period and extends for a distance of at least 10 metres from any junction. Thus preventing vehicles mistakenly parking during the hours of darkness and contravening provisions of the Roads Vehicles Lighting Regulations 1994.
- The introduction of such measures will not leave the Police with the task of carrying out constant enforcement issues such as obstruction by transferring the problem to other areas.
- The safety of other road users is not compromised by the introduction of these measures.

Civil Parking Enforcement will require your Authority to ensure resources are available to enforce this proposal.

Waiting Restrictions and On-street Parking Places: Dernier Road & Chiltern Way

Thank you for your letter dated 13th December on this matter.

I think it is absolutely appropriate that there should be some parking restrictions on Dernier Road at the entrance to Rowan Mews for the reasons that have already been noted regarding access for emergency vehicles. The residents of Rowan Mews have long held the view that this is a problem that should have been addressed when the development was originally given planning permission. (I write in a personal capacity but as a director of the Rowan Mews Residents' Association, I am well aware of the views on this matter as it has been a topic of discussion at every one of our Annual general Meetings for the past five years.)

Unfortunately, I think that this may be an intractable problem. Whilst the proposed restrictions at the junction of Dernier Road and the entrance to the Rowan Mews development would solve one problem by allowing easier access for large vehicles I do not believe it would address the problems of congestion on Chiltern Way. Restricting parking on the road junction itself, by properties 19 and 26, would be beneficial in allowing for improved visibility and would, from a road safety point of view by beneficial. However, these restrictions would result in vehicles parking further down Chiltern Way, and I imagine the owners of these properties may raise objections- though I imagine that these would be for aesthetic reasons rather than considerations of traffic access and road safety.

Perhaps there is a compromise that would restrict parking as indicated in the plan accompanying your letter but without a restriction on the short stub between properties 19 and 21/23?

Unfortunately, it seems that the problem of parking has two root causes. The first is related to the present lack of restrictions on Dernier Road which clearly causes an access problem. But the additional root cause seems to be that the Rowan Mews Development simply doesn't have sufficient parking spaces for residents and visitors, and that this results in increased parking on the adjoining roads. For this there simply is no solution.

I hope that you are able to at least resolve the problem at the Dernier Road/Rowan Mews junction in a way that meets the needs of all interested parties.

I would like to register my objection to the new parking restrictions on Dernier Road and Chiltern Way.

Parking on Dernier Road is already an significant issue as a number of houses have more than one car and there appears to be a significant number of non residents who regularly park on the street. Very often the street is completely 'full'. I would therefore be concerned about the impact that parking restrictions would have at the end of Rowan Mews. Looking at the your proposals I would have the following concerns and questions:

- My primary concern would be the loss of parking directly in front on number 1 and 2. This will
 inevitably squeeze the parking provision which could result in a number of residents unable to park
 adjacent to their property. This is of particular concern as there are a number of people on the road
 that I would think this would raise accessibility concerns for as it may mean they are force to park in
 surrounding streets and therefore be faced with a long walk from their house that they may not
 easily be able to manage.
- Whilst I agree that people should not park in the areas marked around the bend on Chiltern Way
 and the T Junction it seems to me that there is adequate guidance here in the highway code
 (sections 239-247) and I think common sense should prevail here and there is a danger of setting a
 precedent for petty regulation down quiet side streets do we really want all bend to have double
 yellow lines on in Tonbridge?
- When permission was given for the development at Rowan Mews presumable the council conducted due diligence to verify that emergency and refuse vehicle access was possible? Whilst I have only lived at the property for a few years this would presumably have been a key consideration and would have needed to have been discussed with the then local residence in advance of the development, not subsequently.
- Whilst I am concerned about the cost of investigating and implementing this proposal in council man hours it does not seem to be a particularly critical issue and could the money not be better spent on school books or something of more relevance to Tonbirdge residents more widely. However if the proposal does need to be investigated I think it needs to be done professionally and with due diligence. The proposal was not accompanied by any drawings confirming that the current parking bays would obstruct vehicle turning circles. Has any computer aided swept path analysis been done to understand the physical constraints in detail? It may for instance be that issues arise when people park slightly over the current restrictions as occasionally happens and the only way to verify this is to check it on a CAD package I work for a large engineering company and we would certainly do this type of analysis in a similar situation.
- Has an option that restricts parking only on one side been considered, larger vehicles could then approach from Chiltern Way? I would doubt this would be an issue for regular users such as refuse trucks who could always turn right into Rowan Mews, I would have thought fire tenders could turn rapidly at the end of Chiltern Way in the event they had approached from Dernier Road.
- Aside from the general comments has there been a reported incident where a refuse collection was actually prevented because the trucks could not physically gain access to the road?

Dear Mr Bracey.

I refer to your letter dated 13th December re the above.

Your original proposal for parking restrictions to allow emergency vehicle access to Rowan Mews was understandable even though the problem was caused in the first place by the ridiculous parking provisions allowed in the original planning consent granted for Rowan Mews.

Once granted again in its revised format (with reduced parking provision for an increase in accommodation) problems were going to follow as sure as night follows day. This has now happened.

Despite there being a small majority against your original proposal I am staggered that you have come up with a further proposal even more controversial that the first. Do you just ignore the views of people who take the time and trouble to write to you ?

Surely you must realise that your latest proposal will cause a very serious traffic hazard in Chiltern Way as parking displaced by your proposal will obviously park in Chiltern Way. It will have no where else to go.

All houses in Chiltern Way (apart from the flats at the top end) have drives where owners,occupants and their visitors park off road. Vehicles drive on but reverse back on to the public highway off these driveways. This is not a problem at present as there is very nearly always good visibility in both directions to carry out this maneouvre safely.

We already have non occupiers cars parking overnight in Chiltern Way and the large increase your proposal will force in the levels of on road parking will cause a severe restriction in vision, in both directions, to vehicles reversing on to Chiltern Way from private driveways. Also, if cars park directly opposite existing driveways there are going to be real problems as Chiltern Way is not wide enough to allow this.

If you have to ensure access to Rowan Mews I suggest you revert to your original proposal as this would be the lesser of the evils.

If you insist in proceeding with this latest proposal you will undoubtedly be the cause of accidents. It will only be a matter of time before there will be potentially very serious accidents with collisions between cars reversing from drives unable to see approaching traffic. Any traffic using Chiltern Way will be unable to see cars reversing onto the highway before it is too late to avoid.

Hopefully, this time, you will take notice of the views of residents who clearly see the folly of what you are proposing.

While I note the points made about access and turning, I do wonder why this issue has suddenly arisen. In the past, when Rowan House existed on the Rowans Mews site, ambulances were often called to the institution and there was never a problem with access. The new development has been in place now for, what, approximately 7 years? Up until now the issue of emergency vehicle access has never arisen. A fire engine regularly passes through Chiltern Way, having come from Dernier Road and they obviously have no problem getting through the roads and around the corners implicated in this application, nor does the refuse collection lorry, which turns into Rowan Mews every Friday morning to empty their bins.

I feel it necessary to point out again the problems already faced by residents in Chiltern Way as a result of parking restrictions imposed in Yardley Park Road over the last two years, and in Dernier Road by the existence of The Rowans development.

The entrance to Chiltern Way at the junction with Yardley Park Road is now narrowed every working day by people who work in Tonbridge but who wish to avoid parking charges, who park in Chiltern Way and walk to town. They park, often without thought for other drivers, by stationing their vehicles directly opposite each other (thus leaving room for only one vehicle to pass though carefully) and by parking just after the bend in the road which leads to the rest of Chiltern Way. This often creates a real safety issue for cars travelling round that bend as well as creating problems for Chiltern Way residents who need to reverse out of their drives and whose vision is restricted by these parked vehicles.

We have also found that owing to the increase in vehicular traffic on Chiltern Way as a result of the new houses being built, that during the day other transient cars are parked in Chiltern Way restricting view and turning space for those of us reversing out of our drives (another health and safety issue). In the evening, Dernier Road residents who are unable to park by their own homes are already forced to park on Chiltern Way. Should you restrict further the space available for the residents on Dernier Road to be able to park close to their own homes, a greater number will be forced to park down Chiltern Way, further restricting passage and access to residents.

I believe it not only unfair and unsafe to squeeze the parking space available even more onto the road which sits between Yardley Park Road and Dernier Road, but that causing more vehicles to be displaced, thus having them park on both sides of Chiltern Way right the way down (this latter comment is made, based on looking at the number of cars, which would be affected by the yellow lines), would cause a serious safety issue. On-Street Parking - Chiltern Way/Dernier Road

I refer to your letter dated 13 December 2012 regarding the proposed parking restrictions for Chiltern Way and Dernier Road, and now attach a list of 34 residents who have registered their objection to the current proposal.

The enclosed list represents the vast majority of residents of Chiltern Way who feel strongly that the proposal in its present form will cause more problems than it is intended to solve, with health and safety featuring high among their concerns. Whilst it is my understanding a number of residents have conveyed their views to your office directly I am taking the opportunity to pass on comments tendered when names were added enthusiastically to the enclosed list.


- 1 Many residents find it difficult to understand why the problem has suddenly arisen when those with long term knowledge of the area believe the parking problem to be no worse now that it has been for many years.
- 2 Is the Council prepared to accept a request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 to disclose the origin of the complaint/s leading to the proposal ?
- 3 Residents would be interested to learn why the democratically expressed objection resulting from the public consultation to the initial proposal has been ignored by Council and a more extensive proposal that is likely to impact on a larger number in the wider area has been substituted. The exercise does appear to have been a waste of Council Tax Payers funds.
- 4 If the subject of the complaint arises through access to Rowan Mews it is relevant to point Out that, prior to this development, the width of its access drive was less than at present. The Fire Service were often called to site (then occupied by Rowan House) and, along with refuse vehicles, were driven into the area with little known difficulty.

- 5 Without doubt, measures taken to relieve parking problems in one area will simply transfer it to another, as evidenced by the exercise when restrictions were introduced in adjacent Yardley Park Road. Consequently, drivers prevented from parking their vehicles under the current proposal will have little option but to park the length of Chiltern Way, both sides of the road, and each side of every private driveway. This has already shown to cause blind spots for residents needing to reverse on/off their drives, resulting in accidents of which two have occurred in the last 12 months. Furthermore, moving vehicles, including those of the emergency services, will be left with a single track in the centre of the road.
- 6 The sharp bend at the junction of Chiltern Way/Cheviot Close is already a known hazard. With the reduction of spaces for parking created by the proposal it seems inevitable that vehicles will be parked close to, or even at, this dangerous spot. If the Council intends to pursue the proposal it will need to address this point.
- 7 Regular kerb side parking in Chiltern Way will impede Council cleaning activities. This, along with the parking itself, will do nothing to enhance what has hitherto been the pleasant environment that attracted home owners to the area, many of whom are subject to the second highest rate of Council Tax. The proposal, if executed will, it is feared, have a detrimental effect on the area and depress property values.

Finally, I have been asked to raise the question whether the Council would be prepared to hold a public meeting on this subject prior to the final decision being taken.

I look forward to receiving your acknowledgment and comments.







Unfortunately I am not in agreement with the proposals put forward for the reasons set out below:

In your letter accompanying the proposed plan it was stated that the Borough Council was asked by residents to look at introducing new parking restrictions *to ease access and to prevent obstruction of the road.* This, in my view, has not been achieved. Currently, residents entering or leaving Market Quarter have to negotiate their way down a single track of Annison Street due to cars permanently parked on one side of the road (sometimes on both). This often entails meeting another car halfway and one of the drivers having to back-up. This proves quite difficult if the one backing-up then meets another car, and especially dangerous if they are backing-up onto the busy Slade road. The proposal as it stands will continue to allow cars to be parked on Annison Street. Also, it is understood that the proposed development of 180 High Street and the proposed larger development behind 182 High Street envisages those residents using Annison Street for access/egress thus exacerbating the situation.

It seems sense therefore to make Annison Street, as the main thoroughfare of Market Quarter (and, in due course, a possible alternative entrance/exit to the Slade area), no-waiting at any time on both sides. Also, there is a large council car park a short walk away. Unlike the rest of the Slade area, all residents of the Market Quarter have an allotted parking space (as will the proposed developments), visitors can use the council car park (providing much needed income to the council), so there is no reason for any extra parking spaces on Annison Street.

Currently cars park at the entrance to Bradley Street and cause traffic exiting Bradley Street to move onto the right-hand side of the road (the wrong side), which often means meeting cars trying to enter from Annison Street, head-on. The proposal does little to improve the situation. It is suggested that double yellow lines be provided on both sides of the entrance to Bradley Street from Annison Street and down the initial narrow stretch to where Bradley Street widens. This would allow traffic free flow to enter and exit Bradley Street and fulfil the requirements set out as the objective above and also that of the Highway Code (see page 82 para. 242 et al of the current DoT Official Highway Code) with respect to causing obstruction.

It is also proposed to allow parking to non-residents on a Sunday. It should be noted however, that $\sqrt{2}$ Sunday continues to be a busy day for parking in the Slade area due to all the close-by activities on

that day e.g. football and rugby on the Racecourse Playing Fields, canoeing on the river etc. as well as the usual daily activities which continue on Sunday i.e. swimming and shopping/restaurants on the High Street, the Tourist Information Centre and the tours of the Gate House. There is often a battle for spaces on Stafford Road on a Sunday between Slade residents and non-residents. Sunday is supposed to be a little more restful than the other days. The proposal would not support this and would (if implemented) actually make Sunday the most difficult day for Market Quarter residents. It would therefore be to the benefit of residents if the restrictions included Sunday.

Thank you for your letter dated 13th December concerning restrictions on Rochester Road Aylesford.

I agree with the proposed restrictions, but would once again ask you to consider the issue of parking on the stream-side of the road (north bound traffic) that now routinely takes place. Residents choose to park here in an attempt to stem the flow of traffic. By making the road difficult to negotiate ,it is felt that this will dissuade vehicles from using the village and curb speeding. The restrictions proposed will be most effective if double yellow lines are run the length of the north bound carriageway – if this doesn't happen I fear that a chicane will be created making the road difficult to cross for residents, restricting access to properties and making the road dangerous to all users. I would ask that you consider this as an option – a few extra yellow lines would make the road a lot safer!





Although we welcome a review of parking arrangements in Aylesford we are not fully supportive of the proposals for Unwin Close.

The proposals outlined in your formal consultation will only encourage people to park in Unwin Close, unless protection is provided for residents. It does not go far enough to provide for safe exiting of Unwin Close onto Rochester Road. The curvature of the road from Unwin Close southward down Rochester Road requires that the double yellow lines are extended down to the entrance of the access to the amenity land to the rear of 12 Unwin Close. At the present moment a number of commercial vehicles are parking, regularly, beyond the point identified by your yellow line which already makes safe exiting difficult. 



Although supporting introduction of parking restrictions, my wife and I are not completely happy with the proposals for changes to on-street parking arrangements in Unwin Close.

The proposed parking restriction on the South East side of the Rochester Road/Unwin Close junction does not extend far enough down the South East side of Rochester Road. At the moment large vans are habitually parked in Rochester Road in such a way that they render it hazardous to attempt to drive out of Unwin Close, because they restrict visibility of traffic driving in a NE direction up Rochester Road. We are concerned that if the "junction protection" lines do not extend far enough into Rochester Road, this lack of visibility would still be a problem for us and for our neighbours.

As my wife and I are both disabled, we are reliant on people coming to assist us with day to day living and to take us to medical appointments. Trying to turn left or right out of Unwin Close is very difficult with vehicles parking close to the junction and we fully support the introduction of junction protection lines to help with this problem. However, I reiterate that in order to be effective, the lines need to extend further down Rochester Road than shown on the drawing supplied (DD/559/3).

Dear Sir/Madam

I am in favour of the current Borough Councils proposals for changes to the on-going street parking arrangements in Unwin Close. However, I do not think the planned proposals go far enough. I would like to request that the double yellow lines are extended from the current plans from Unwin Close down to the Public footpath entrance of Rochester Road. This extension will be level with the lines that are planned for the road side of the island outside 72 – 78 Rochester Road.

The reason for my request is the safety of pedestrians (Children) who cross the Rochester Road from the island. There are around 11 children who use this part of the road to cross. It is becoming more difficult to cross the road safely as the space opposite 72-78 has been used for commercial vehicles parking (see photo No 1) from early afternoon until early next morning and including all weekend. There is an average of two vehicles at any one time but on occasions there are three high sided vehicles parked in the space between 72-78 Rochester Road. It is near on impossible to cross Rochester Road from East to West because of these high sided vehicles. In addition, it would appear very difficult for vehicles to exit Unwin Close (see photo No 2, 3 and 4) and the houses with a private drive opposite 72 -78 Rochester Road.

There is also the issue of cars using the small access road outside 72-78 Rochester Road as a cut through when the traffic in Rochester Road is tailed back in both directions due to the obstruction caused by these vehicles. This occurs mostly during the morning/evening rush hours but also on a Thursday when the rubbish is being collected.

I do not have any concerns about cars parking in this space facing 72-78 Rochester Road because, as pedestrians, you can have sight of oncoming vehicles. However, this is not possible when high sided vehicles are parked in the space. My children and I have been forced back on to the pavement several times by cars trying to negotiate through the gaps in parked vehicles on many times. We have also witnessed others trying to cross the road with difficulty.

I do not think that my proposal to extend the yellow lines would affect any of the residents living in Rochester Road/Unwin Close. All residents have off road parking for two or more cars (see photo No 5). There are no houses affected by the loss of a couple of parking spaces and it would also help with the issue of commercial vehicles being parked in a residential area. Indeed I have spoken to a number of my neighbours who have expressed their agreement with my proposals. I've lived in my current house for 12 years and these spaces are rarely used. There have been occasions when the Working Men's Club had events on where vehicles were parked all the way up Rochester Road but this has not happened for some time because the club reminds members that there is a large car park at the rear of the club for patrons to use without charge.

There are also addition concerns regarding vehicles exiting from the slip road outside 72 Rochester Road. Vehicles are forced on to the wrong side of the Rochester Road when turning south towards the village. This is compounded by vehicles who are also trying to negotiate exiting from the drive way opposite 72 Rochester Road.

I feel there are serious concerns regarding safety of pedestrians and vehicles using Rochester Road and the junctions with Mount Pleasant/Unwin Close and this is an ideal opportunity to resolve any outstanding safety concerns that have been drawn to your attention at this consultation period. I would also like to add that Aylesford Quarry is mostly closed with the exception of early morning deliveries. During the summer of 2012, there were up to 20 cars parked at any one time (mostly at weekends when youngsters would park up at use the quarry as a leisure pool. The Police were called many times throughout the summer by us and other neighbours regarding the dangerous use of the quarry lake. I m sure parking restrictions would help in preventing large numbers of cars being parked all over the Mount Pleasant/Unwin Close junction.

Thank you for your letter P4/15-45 Form 45 dated 13 December 2012 asking for comment. This extension of the current restrictions in Rectory Lane North to "at all times" only adds insult to injury. These restrictions have already resulted in significant extra costs to Leybourne school.

In addition, as a Church Warden, the imposition of these restrictions and their knock on effects have resulted in turning the parking arrangements for baptisms, wedding and funerals at Leybourne Church into a nightmare. Accepting that hearses and wedding cars can ignore the double yellow lines outside the Church commuter traffic parking in the Church layby means that guests attending these services are unable to park. In my earlier reply I mentioned the difficulties of hearse carrying my father-in-law's coffin to access the layby at all. Guest cars now have to park in Oxley Shaw compounding the School's parking difficulties.

I understand from the Parish Council that the Borough Council is looking a strategic parking plan for Leybourne as a whole. Can I urge the Tonbridge and Malling Joint Transportation Board to address the issues of parking in Leybourne with some urgency.

The imposition of parking restrictions in Rectory Lane North in isolation was ill conceived.
