1 <u>CAPITAL PROJECTS – POST IMPLEMENTATION REVIEWS</u>

Summary

Capital Plan Post Implementation Reviews (PIRs) are brought forward for consideration in respect of Larkfield Leisure Centre Soft Play Air Conditioning, Tonbridge Pool Health Suite and Tonbridge Pool Remedial Works.

1.1 Introduction

- 1.1.1 Management Team reported to the meeting of the Finance and Property Advisory Board on 5 October 2005 outlining why PIRs needed to be carried out and recommending a proposed monitoring system. A template was agreed as to how the PIRs should be presented and it was agreed that these should be submitted to the appropriate Board in accordance with the Capital strategy.
- 1.1.2 This report is the latest in a series of PIRs which have been submitted to this Board.

1.2 Larkfield Leisure Centre – Soft Play Air Conditioning

1.2.1 Attached at **[Annex 1]** is the relevant PIR template for this Capital scheme. The new air conditioning has been well received by customers and has helped increase income by 15% in the summer months compared to the previous year. Members will note the proposal to utilise some of the underspend on the project to provide wall mounted fans in the cafeteria area.

1.3 Tonbridge Pool – Health Suite

1.3.1 Attached at **[Annex 2]** is the relevant PIR template for this Capital scheme. The improvements have been well received by customers and have increased the range of treatment and beauty therapy services available. Income has risen as a result of the works and it is hoped some minor additional works to the foyer ceiling and lighting will be progressed shortly.

1.4 Tonbridge Pool – Remedial Works

1.4.1 Attached at **[Annex 3]** is the relevant PIR template for this Capital scheme. The outdoor pool has been tiled by specialist contractors and the facility has been well used over the summer months. The improvements have been well received by customers and the outdoor pool remains very popular.
