1.	Car Parking	Comment: A large area for parking divided into sections by trees and bollards, no specific disabled parking. Speed ramps and sleeping policemen present though are not clearly marked.		
		Recommendations: The items below are all to be addressed as part of the current Capital Scheme for the Sportsground: (i) Designated disabled parking bays to be marked out with road paint. (ii) The bollards in the car park need marking with reflective material, to aid visibility. (iii) The speed ramps need clearly marking to avoid them being found unexpectedly. 2.	Paths	Comment: Many hard standing paths are provided within the Sportsground and some are in need of remedial works.		
		Recommendations: (i) Identify any potholes and repair as required. (ii) Uneven paving slabs and a raised drain cover by the main entrance to	500	1
		the pavilion need addressing. (iii) Two areas near the paths with unguarded steep drops into ditches where ditches cross over paths need preventative measures to stop this.	500 500	1 2

	Recommendations: Keep paths and gates clear of overhanging vegetation as required.	No cost	1
4. Pavilion	Comment: The pavilion was opened in 1984, and was not therefore built to the current disability access standards. The front of the building was originally intended to be the back of the building, hence some of the facilities including the toilets are now located at the rear of the building. The approach to the building was felt to be uninviting, with no signage, or indication that this was a public building. Inside the building the walls were exposed brick with a dark floor tile, light levels were generally low. There are male and female toilets and a separate disabled toilet within the building, but there is no disabled/unisex changing area.		
	Recommendations: All the items below are to be considered within a broader review of the building: (i) Lighting, in particular within the entrance lobby, needs improvement. (ii) Directional signage inside the building needs replacement. (iii) Highlighting the bottom of the wall and floor tiles in contrasting colour to make this more visible. (iv) Highlighting the door surrounds internally and externally in lighter contrasting colour to make them more visible. (v) Subject to demand, consider converting one changing room into a unisex/disabled changing area with wet room and toilet.	Costs to be considered as part of the broader building review.	1 2 1 1 2

5.	Toilets	Comment: A separate disabled toilet is provided within the pavilion but this located at the rear of the building, not clearly sign posted and the pavilion is rarely open. (see notes on the pavilion). The nearest accessible toilet to the site is at Tonbridge Cemetery which is approximately 1km from the site. (The Ridgeway toilets have no disabled toilets). The Bowling Green and Tonbridge Angels Football Club were not visited on this occasion but have their own toilet facilities open to users of those facilities only. Recommendations: Consider options for providing toilets at the Sportsground, potentially within the broader review of the building.	Costs to be considered as part of the broader building review	1
6.	Outdoor Signs	Comment: There is one main sign and four others in the children's play area, with limited directional signage.		
		Recommendations: Install directional signage towards the main features in the Sportsground, as part of the existing Capital Scheme for the Sportsground.	£1,500	1
