As you will appreciate from the above, the amount received in fees has been far outweighed by the resources necessary to administer this Act on behalf of the 12 District/Borough Councils.

In addition to the costs incurred in respect of Company Searches and Finance Checks on the applicants, five representations were made resulting in correspondence and lengthy formal meetings between the Head and Assistant Head of Trading Standards.

One applicant appealed to the Magistrates Court and was refused.

Another applicant is due to attend a meeting with the Head and Assistant Head of Trading Standards in the very near future and is likely to proceed to an appeal at the Magistrates Court.
