What is Love Where You Live?



- Love Where You Live has been developed in partnership with businesses, national and local government, land managers and civil society organisations to develop a single, unified "antilittering" approach.
- Love Where You Live sets out to encourage a sense of civic pride across communities
- Aims to drive 3,000,000 people and 3,000 organisations to take action over the next three years — we want to change littering behaviour & significantly reduce the amount of litter in England by 2020.



Aims



- Inspires and enables everyone to take action to reduce littering and improve the quality of local places
- Engages the public in changing behaviours and drives local action through fostering pride and understanding
- Raise the profile of how important caring for local places is given its importance to individuals' quality of life
- Encourages, supports and brings together leaders from government, business, media and civil society.









