1 **COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT FUND – DEFERRED BIDS**

1.1 **Background**

- 1.1.1 Following the meeting of Communities and Health Advisory Board on 23 September 2014, the decision was taken to defer payment of funds to applicants who had failed to provide evidence of match funding in support of their project.
- 1.1.2 Annex 1 lists the bids that fall into this category "Capital Bids with no Match Funding". It was appreciated that the applications are worthwhile and that support should be given, however the guidelines for the fund indicated that "Bids for 100%" of project costs are unlikely to be accepted".
- 1.1.3 In order to be consistent with other applicants who have provided an additional element of funding, it was decided that all the applicants listed in Annex 1 would be asked to provide further details of any financial contribution they are able to make in order to support their bid. A request for additional information has been sent out and the outcomes from this will be circulated.

1 **KENT SAVERS CREDIT UNION**

Following the Management Team's report to the Advisory Board on 23 September, this report provides an update to some of the issues raised by Members. A further verbal update will be provided at the meeting.

1.1 Introduction

- 1.1.1 At the meeting of this Advisory Board on 23 September, Members considered the letter from the President of Kent Savers to the Leader of the Council. In that letter, Kent Savers asked that the Council offer financial support by way of a subordinated loan of £10,000.
- 1.1.2 In the last report, we advised that the legal advice from our Legal team was that the nature of loan requested is likely to amount to State Aid, which would be unlawful. However, an unconditional grant would avoid the state aid issues as the De Minimus Exemption applies.
- 1.1.3 Accordingly, Members were asked to consider whether they wish to consider awarding to Kent Savers an unconditional grant of £10,000.
- 1.1.4 At the meeting, Members decided to defer a decision regarding financial support until the next meeting of the Advisory Board to enable further investigation with Kent Savers into the following issues:
 - 1) further information on how the residents of Tonbridge and Malling would benefit:
 - consideration as to whether consultation with local churches would be 2) beneficial; and
 - 3) further clarity surrounding the legal position.

1.2 Update

- 1.2.1 The Director of Finance & Transformation contacted Chris Hunt the General Manager of Kent Savers who has provided some further information to assist in the discussion.
- 1.2.2 Kent Savers have over 1,800 active members across Kent, Medway and Bexley; 91 of these are in Tonbridge & Malling with savings deposits of £80,000 and loans outstanding of £34,500. Members will be aware from discussion at the last meeting, that TMBC has not provided revenue support to Kent Savers in the past unlike some other districts, and therefore the targeted promotion in our area has thus far not been as high as in some other areas of Kent and Medway.
- 1.2.3 Mr Hunt has assured us that if a grant were awarded, more targeted work in the TMBC area would be undertaken. He reiterated recent examples of partnership working delivered locally; viz:
 - worked with Russet Homes on a membership promotion to their tenants
 - trained the staff at the Tonbridge Gateway to be able to inform the public about Kent Savers
 - established relationships with churches in Aylesford, Hildenborough, West
 Malling and Walderslade on the border between T&M and Medway
 - made contact with a business in Kings Hill
 - worked with the Projects Co-ordinator at Tonbridge & Malling CAB
 - partnered with the carers charity that covers West Kent
 - gave a presentation to the Tonbridge & Malling LSP
- 1.2.4 In terms of the work with churches, Mr Hunt has confirmed that Kent Savers would be happy to work with any churches that make contact. He has pointed out that when the agreement with the Diocese was made, the Diocese stipulated that churches must contact Kent Savers and not the other way around. The Director of Finance and Transformation has liaised with Cllr Cure outside of the meeting and has passed on the contact details should a particular church mentioned at the last meeting wish to get involved.
- 1.2.5 Legal Services are revisiting the State Aid Regulations and a verbal update to clarify the legal position will be given at the meeting.
