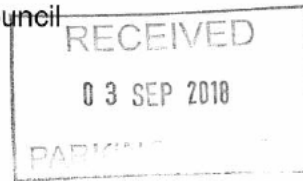

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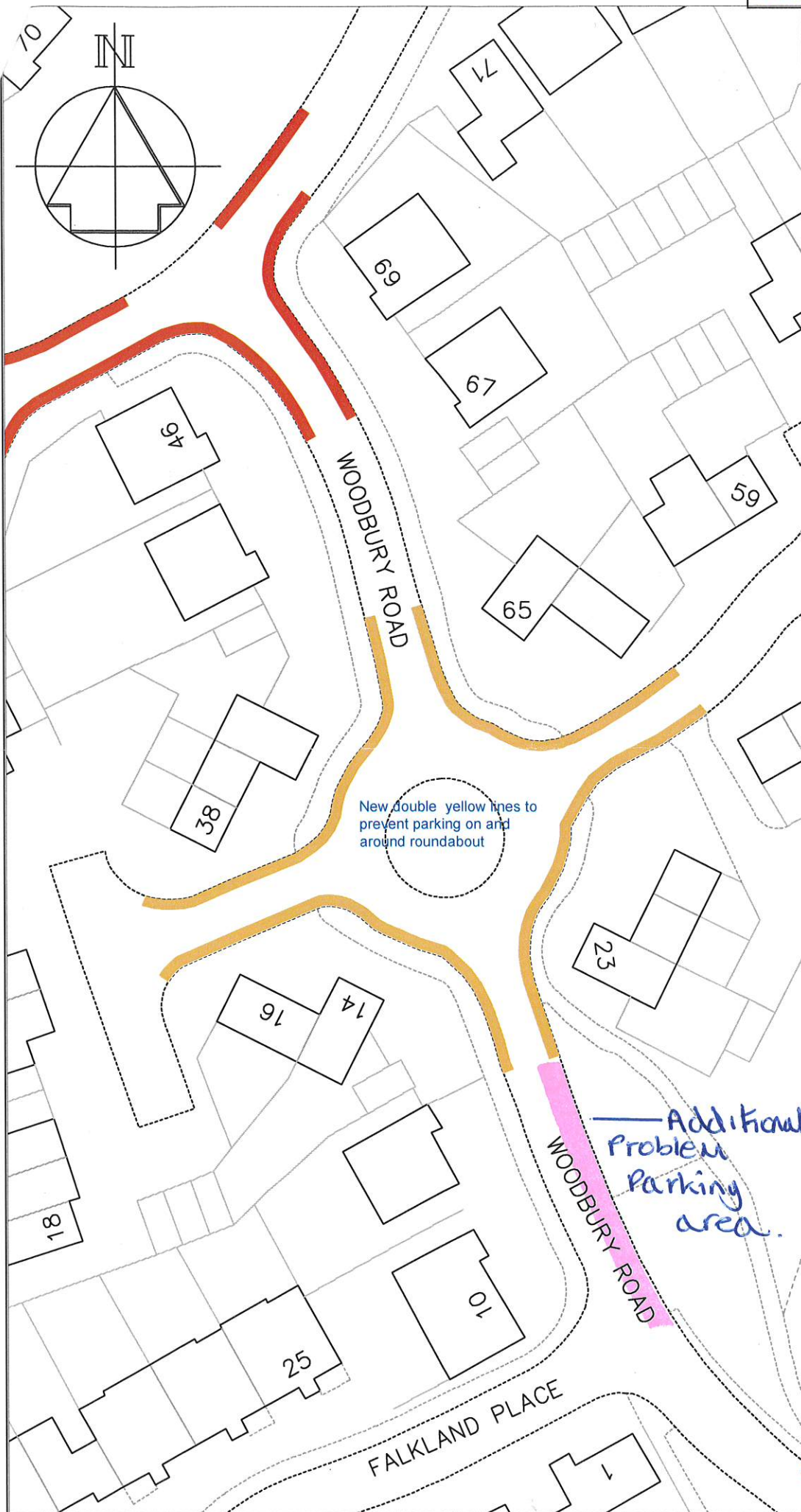

I am writing in response to the proposed changes to yellow parking lines on Woodbury Road, Walderslade. Reference number in the title of this email.

Comments:

We are in favour of the Borough Council's proposals for the changes to on-street parking arrangements for Woodbury Road, Walderslade shown on plans DD/583/2.

Ultimately we agree that the proposed yellow lines around the roundabout on Woodbury Road should be implemented because large commercial vans and cars park here continuously, making the roundabout more dangerous due to limited space and vision. We also believe this would highly impede emergency vehicles, particularly the fire brigade and ambulance service, gaining access to the lower part of the road where we and the fire hydrant (outside number 69) is located. They also park over the pavement which makes it extremely difficult for pedestrians, wheelchair users or prams to utilise the path for safety.

However, I do not believe it necessary to extend the lines as much as they are proposed down the two side roads, off the main road. I believe this would create problems elsewhere on the main road, due to this creating a lack of parking for these smaller properties with less off-street parking.

I believe double yellow lines could be used on just one side of the road on the side roads, to allow for some parking here. I also believe it would be beneficial to extend the double yellows on the main road on one side to prevent cars parking either side of the road (double parking) and therefore restricting the access of the main road. For example further down from number 65. With lines implemented on the round about this is very likely to be the negative side effect further down the road.

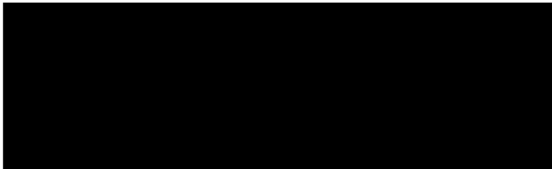
I wish to add my support for the proposed Yellow Lines banding on the roundabout in Woodbury Road Walderslade.

The current situation is untenable and civil action should have been taken long ago. Cars and vans are parked in an obstructive and dangerous manner.

How the Refuse and delivery lorries cope beggars belief and damage is being caused to the roundabout. Emergency vehicles would have great difficulty traversing the road and serious delays could occur.

Dear Andy Bracey,

I write to you as you can see on the heading of this letter, that for my sins or may be my stupidity, quite a few years ago took on the task of the Neighbourhood Watch Officer. This as you know in your position as Parking Manager for the local authority, that we can offer only sympathy to the many complaints, and moans, regarding parking problems in the area of Woodbury Road.


The double yellow lines you put outside house numbers 69 and 46 are being parked on (See photographs) incidentally the occupants of both of those properties have moved /changed because of the problems. Both were close friends.

I personally have attended many meetings with both Police and Local Council Officials .(see documents) all have expressed sympathy--- but no solution. Now we are about to enter in, or given the opportunity to have another set of yellow lines. I feel the same problems will exist, until a system is in place to put a ticket on an offender and a fine imposed.

I am not allowed to do this as a Neighbourhood Watch Officer. A Community police officer can-not do it Incidentally I have only seen a female officer once in this area in the eleven years we have lived here.

As for our properties  need the use of walking frames, and cannot negotiate the gap shown on the photographs between the hedge and the offending vehicles. They have to venture out into the centre of the road and cross to the opposite pavement.

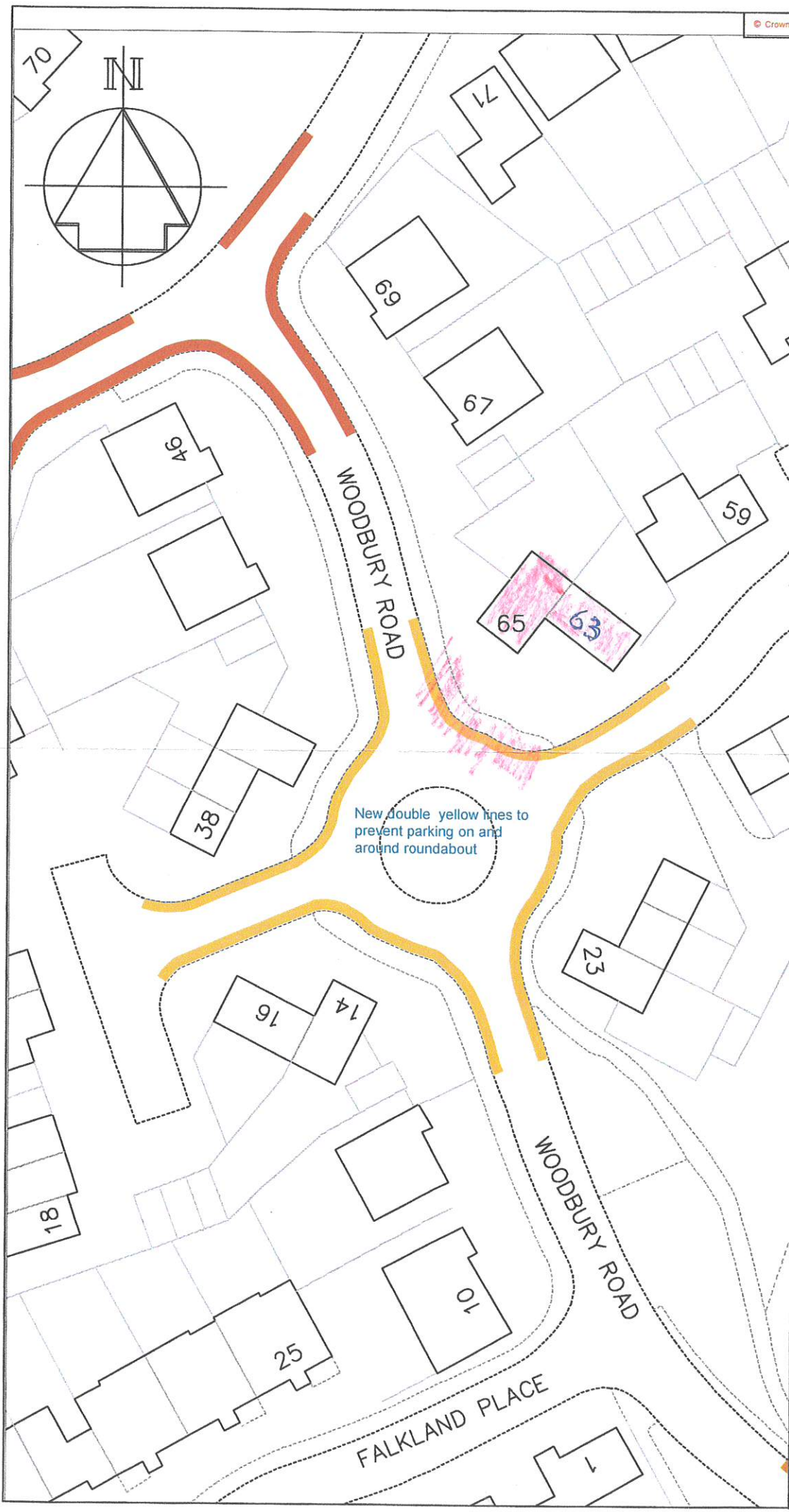

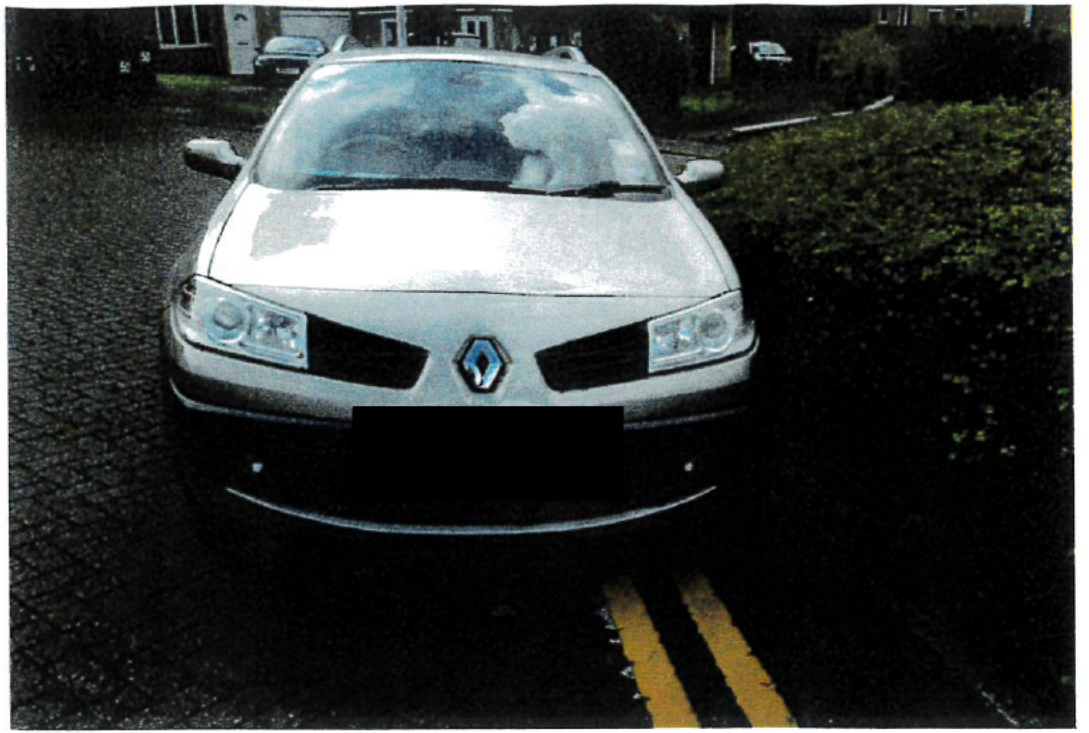

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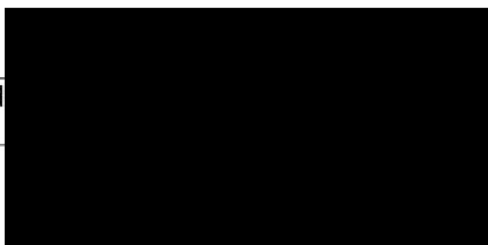

As an existing resident in Woodbury road leading onto the roundabout in question, I understand the problem which faces residents on the roundabout and therefore am fully supporting of double yellow lines around the roundabout, the only issue we have with these plans would be how far the lines come into our cul de sac (as shown in the attached image).

[REDACTED] have three vehicles at this address and parking is already an issue given the amount of drivers in the cul de sac. This act will force those drivers to park in other inappropriate places such as right in front of our house blocking our footpath access to our front door (which is a problem we have faced before when parking became an issue).

This is not only a problem for us but we have elderly family members who visit, some by cars which will have nowhere close enough to park for them to walk the distance, but with no steady access to our front door, this is a problem for all involved.



By parking right outside our house, this also causes problems for our neighbours to the left as the access to their driveways is slim as it is and with local residents finding alternative parking this will also cause problems for those neighbours and block their access increasing risk of accidents in this area, which is clear to see when viewing the driveway to our left.

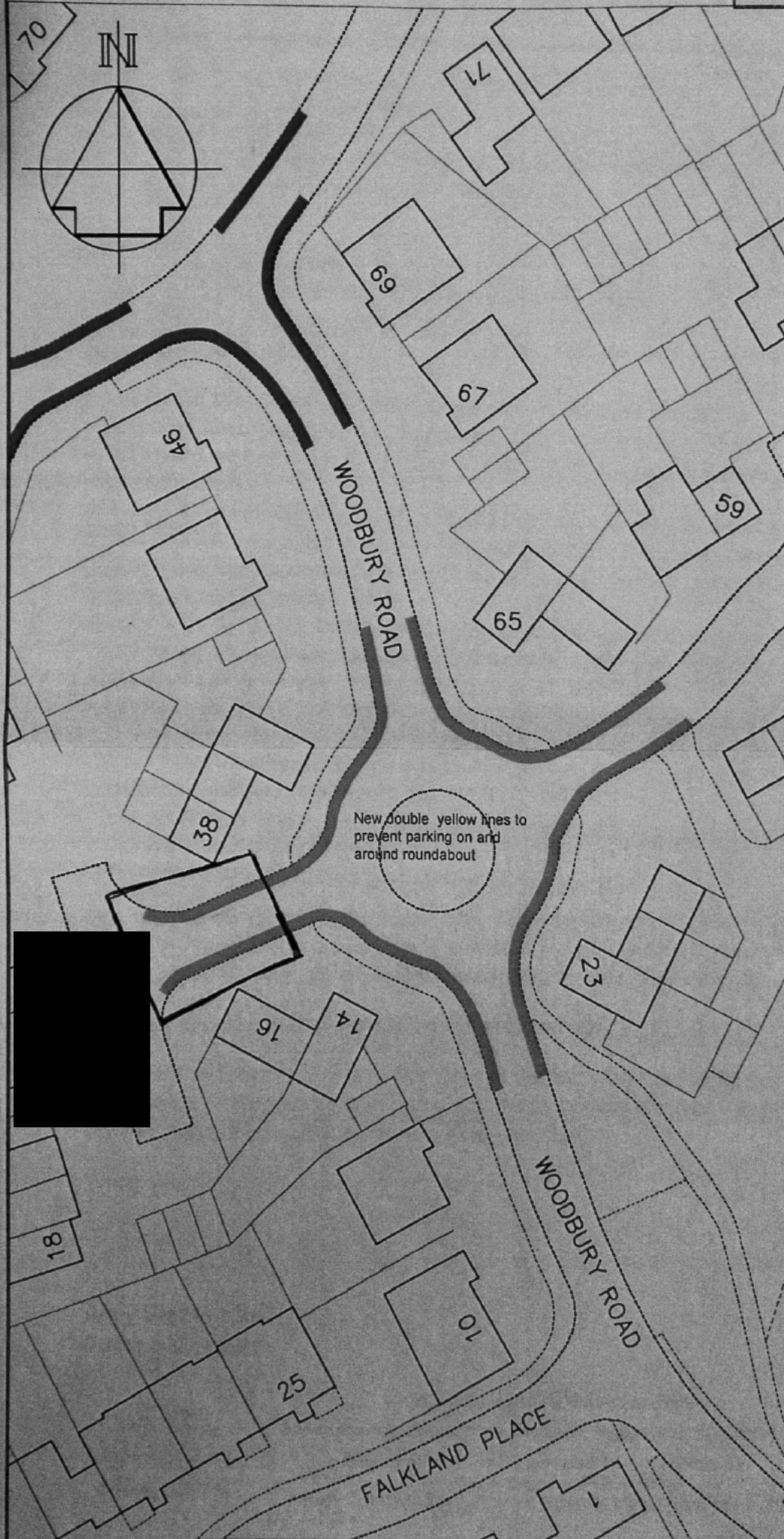

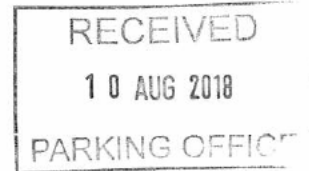

Dear sir,

I am in favour of the borough council's proposal for the double yellow lines in principal, as indicated in the plan, however I would be grateful if you would consider extending the double yellow lines to the entire street in front of numbers 67 on the east side and numbers 44 and 46 on the west side.

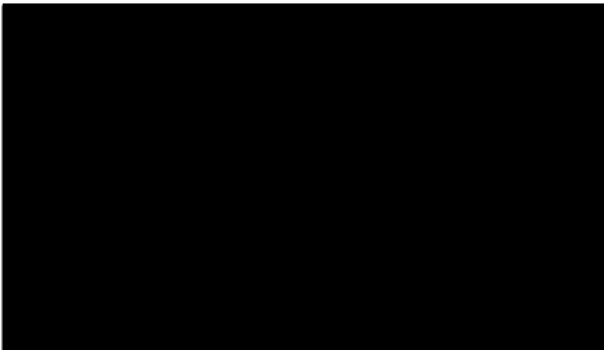
The reason is that this small stretch of road would be the only available on street parking and it is likely that we would have vehicles parked there continuously and in particular large commercial vans which we are plagued with at the moment.

This would pose a hazard and safety issue for vehicles trying to leave their drives from houses numbered 67 and 69 and 44 and 46. Visibility is reduced to a degree where you just have to pull out and hope that nothing is coming as you cannot see. In addition vehicles park on the pavement leaving no room for pedestrians with buggys and prams to pass meaning they have to go out onto the road to get past putting themselves in danger of being hit by a passing vehicle especially where visibility is reduced by the parked vehicles.

When cars are parked both sides it would make it difficult for emergency vehicles to gain access. We have already had an occasion where a fire engine was unable to get through and the fire crew wasted valuable time as they had to manhandle a car out of the way. It was also partially blocking access to a fire hydrant between house numbers 67 and 69.

I have attached a few photos from earlier today so that you can visualise what I have set out above.

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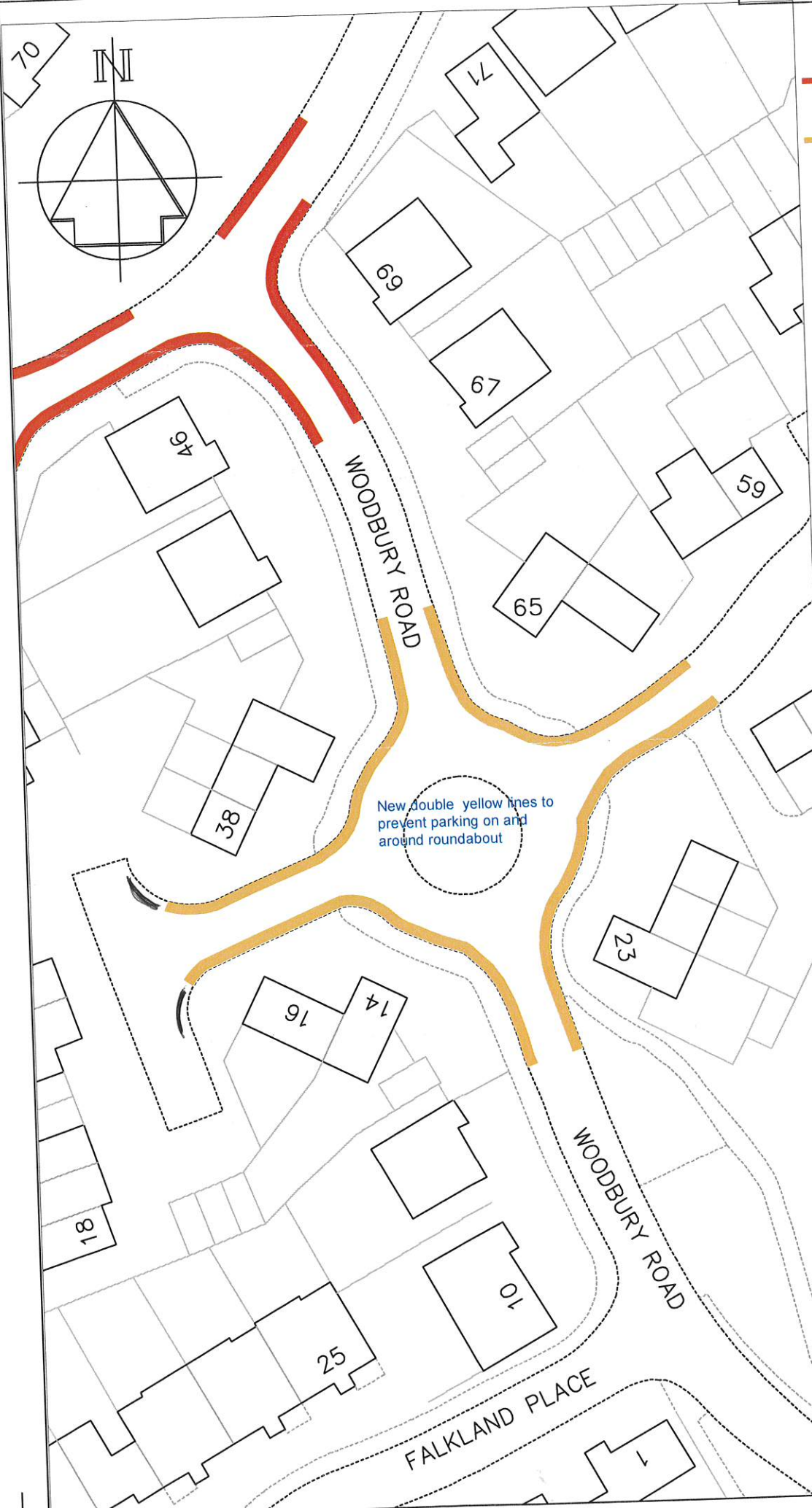

For safety yes I agree with the proposed double yellow lines but I think the householders need to take responsibility for where they park as they do have drives and frontage to their own homes to park their vehicles which they do not seem to use. For those that do not have the frontage it will be a problem to find somewhere else to park. A speed restriction I feel should also be enforced as drivers drive much too fast down that the areas marked red going towards the roundabout. Very often there are schoolchildren and families walking across the road from and to the areas of woodland and also dog walkers.

It has become very congested on the roundabout lately.

I would also suggest more double yellow lines on the bend of Tunbury Avenue at the junction of Woodbury Road and further up on Tunbury Avenue as it leads up to the main Walderslade Woods Road. There is a blind bend with some double yellow lines there already but they do not extend far enough.

Large vehicles are parked on that bend which is restricting to those travelling up towards the Walderslade Woods Road from those coming down Tunbury Avenue which could cause a head on collision.

These are my observations.
