The Operating Schedule will be subject to the contents of the Event Management Plan (EMP). This covers the following (non-exhaustive) list of requirements:-

Site Preparation

Risk Management

Health & Safety

First/Aid Medical

Fire Safety

Capacity & Crowd Management

Access & Egress

Security

Noise Management

Emergency / Evacuation Plan

Transport Management Plan

Missing & Found Child Policy (if appropriate)

The draft EMP for the first proposed event (Matt's BBQ) is attached to this application.

Prior to any function involving the attendance of more than 500 patrons, the Event Safety Advisory Group will be consulted, so long as the said group are in existence in the area.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Prior to any of the date when licensable activities are to take place at the premises, a risk assessment will be undertaken to determine an appropriate number of SIA registered Door Supervisors to be employed at the premises.

Such number will be employed at the premises on the dates that licensable activities are to take place.

A log of those door staff shall be maintained at the premises and shall include:

- -The number of staff on duty
- -The identity of each member of door staff and their SIA number
- -The times the door staff were on duty

Entry to any event taking place under the Premises License shall be by ticket only.

The premises license holder shall use appropriate media (website, social media and e-mail) to communicate appropriate information and conditions to to ticket holders, in advance of an event.

The premises license holder will make adequate provision for monitoring and controlling the number of persons entering the site by way of fencing, gate systems, security or other provision to manage entry, and to prevent unauthorised access to the premises or any part thereof.

The premises shall operate a zero tolerance Drugs Policy. Any person found using drugs will be removed from the premises. Any person found to be dealing drugs will be detained (when it is safe and reasonable to do so) and Kent Police informed immediately. Any drugs seized will be securely stored and handed over to police following any event. The Drugs Policy shall be subject to scrutiny/approval by Kent Police, such approval is to be sought a minimum of 21 days prior to each event unless the EMP and appendices are accepted as conditions of the license.

The premises shall operate a search policy to deter the carrying of drugs or weapons. Such Policy shall be written and subject to scrutiny/approval by Kent Police.

Staff who are to sell alcohol will be trained in the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to the Licensing objectives, and the laws relating to underage sales and the sale of alcohol to intoxicated persons. This training will be documented, and details of it shall be produced to an Authorised Officer on request.

A refusals log will be maintained at each point of sale, recording the time of the refusal, the member of staff who made the

refusal and the reason for such refusal.

Measures shall be put in place to prevent open containers of alcohol being removed from the licensed premises.

c) Public safety

Appropriate and sufficient First Aid and medical equipment/staff shall be available and employed at the premises throughout the course of the event.

An assessment of First Aid Requirements will be undertaken with reference to relevant guidance, in order to determine adequate numbers of First Aid personnel and equipment.

The premises shall maintain a comprehensive incident log throughout the course of the event.

The premises license holder shall have in place Public Liability Insurance.

No drinks will be sold or served in glass containers.

Access shall be maintained into and around the licensed premises for emergency vehicles.

Emergency exits will be determined and will be sufficient for the number of occupants on site.

The emergency exits will be available at all times, manned by stewards and kept free from obstruction.

The use of any special effects and fireworks shall be fully risk-assessed, and details shall be provided in advance to Tonbridge & Malling Borough Council for their approval.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Noise from amplified music or voices shall not be such as to cause a noise nuisance to occupants of nearby premises.

The premises license holder shall appoint a suitably qualified and experienced Acoustic Consultant in relation to the event.

The Consultant shall advise on acoustic arrangements and sound levels prior to the event.

Throughout the event, regular Noise Assessments will be completed by a competent person(s) at the boundary of any noise-sensitive premises.

Steps shall be taken to reduce the level of noise, if the assessments deem it to be necessary.

A record of these assessments shall be maintained, and shall include the time and location of each assessment, the person making it and the results – plus any remedial action taken (if required).

The premises and its exterior shall be cleared of litter at regular intervals throughout an event, and fully and promptly following the end of an event.

Notices will be positioned at the public exits to any event requesting customers to leave in a quiet and orderly manner.

A telephone number for use of nearby residents to report any concerns or issues shall be established and published prior to each event, with all calls to that telephone number being logged – together with remedial action taken.

Measures shall be implemented and adhered to in order to manage queuing outside the licensed premises, where necessary. Queuing lanes will be used where necessary to manage crowds.

A dispersal policy shall be implemented and adhered to. Including the details of the positioning of staff and door staff to manage dispersal of customers from the premises.

Each event for more than 500 persons should prepare a communication and engagement strategy that takes in all local Parish Councils and neighbouring residents or businesses that could be affected by the event.

e) The protection of children from harm

Entry to the licensed premises is only permitted to those over the age of 18 unless specifically marketed as a family event. A Challenge 25 policy shall be implemented in full at the entrance to any event taking place under the Premises License, with full and appropriate identification sought from any person who appears to be under the age of 25.

The only acceptable forms of identification shall be photographic Driving Licenses, Passports, HM forces cards, or a form of identification with the 'PASS' hologram.

Any person who cannot produce full and appropriate identification when requested to do so shall not be permitted entry to the premises if the entry policy is "over-18s only".

Those purchasing tickets to the event shall be advised in advance of the event to bring appropriate identification with them.

A challenge 25 policy shall be implemented in respect of all sales of alcohol. All staff who are to sell alcohol will be trained, and such training will include the Challenge 25 policy and its operation.

Notices shall be displayed in prominent positions at each point of sale indicating that the challenge 25 policy is in force and advising which forms of ID are acceptable.

For events where families are welcome there will continue to be a Challenge 25 Policy at all bar outlets.

For family events a Missing/Found Child welfare point will be established with appropriately trained staff.

For family events the head of security, security supervisors and anyone working on the welfare team will provide a current DBS check.

NOTES ON DEMONSTRATING ENTITLEMENT TO WORK IN THE UK

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways: 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents listed below (which do not need to be certified), or 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay
 indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in
 combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their
 name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
 official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
 Government agency or a previous employer.

- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, less than 6 months old, issued by the Home Office under regulation 18(3) or 20(2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2016, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK
 with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or
 reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration
 decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but
 who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in
 the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within this application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be checked online. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. Applicants who are unable to obtain a share code from the service should submit copy documents as set out above.

NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
