Should a patient become unwell or as so unwell that they need an ambulance to be transferred to hospital (whilst attending the practice), there is no provision for their vehicle being left without an appropriately paid for ticket.

The car park is rarely, if ever, at full capacity and most people park for less than 20 mins to attend either the pharmacy or the post office.

Parents park here AM and PM to avoid parking off street on the road near the two primary schools and the nursery. Having to pay to park at this location will mean these cars will park off street on the nearby roads, causing issues and opening up potential incidents of harm to children attempting to cross roads without clear visual sight of the traffic using the roads around the parked cars.

The impact this proposal will have on the local commercial and retail spaces will be detrimental to their business. Customers will simply go elsewhere and this will impact revenue.

There is no mention in this proposal for the digitally excluded, people with no access to a smart phone and would be unable to pay.

Nor is there any details about how the parking fees will be regulated, which will cost the council more in the long run.

With the exception of a season ticket, which during a cost of living crisis may have a detrimental impact on their take home pay. Thereby meaning staff will be lost from both the GP practice and the retailers.

Therefore, I sincerely object to this proposal on the above basis.

Evidence from boroughs in which these measures have been introduced or have been in operation for some time shows that business is reduced by them, leading people to use out of town shopping centres, and resulting in an increase in the closures of local high street businesses, particularly small independents. It makes no positive contribution, such as turnover, as many people will simply not go to those places if they have to pay.

Where these measures have been introduced near parks and similar open recreational facilities, use of those facilities has dropped and, in several cases, to the extent that they have been sold for redevelopment.

By all means introduce reasonable free parking time limits based around the time that it would reasonably take people to shop in the (already very limited) stores in a local high street and/or stop for a drink or a meal - the principle of free out of town centre and supermarket parking - but charging for parking, unless the cost can be redeemed against that of using a local outlet, is almost invariably to the detriment of local businesses. A free, reasonable time limit is what is more often than not actually evidenced to increase turnover.

As for the very idea that these measures are intended to make the cost of parking fairer across the borough and avoid users of already paid-for car parks and on-road spaces carrying the burden for those that are free, that would insinuate that costs for parking in those existing areas would be reduced by the amount of revenue from any new paid-for parking areas that may be introduced, in order to make the share fairer. Instead, the plan is to increase the charges for parking in these.

Most local authorities are strapped for cash and desperately trying to recoup losses made during over a year, and in some cases almost two, of limited usage of such services or no usage at all. However, local independent businesses have suffered the same or worse, and residents are already

struggling with the current economic situation and the already introduced rises in the cost of local authority services. It is not the responsibility of local residents and business owners to subsidise the results of financial mismanagement by local governments and ill-advised decisions by central government.

This could have a knock on effect to retaining staff who cannot afford the additional parking expenses. This can also affect recruiting, especially for college/uni age students/young people who are looking for work around their studies. They will be earning a low wage and may then have parking charges to pay on top which will discourage them from taking these positions which in turn will affect businesses who will need to pay more to recruit staff of an older age. Shops rely on the younger generation to keep costs down and this age group rely on these jobs to subsidise their student loans and gain valuable experience. Martin Square is not close to a train station so it is not used as a car park for commuters, the people parking there during the day are workers at Martin Square, visitors using the shops, surgery, library, etc and residents who will be most affected by these charges. These should be strongly reconsidered as the charges are detrimental to those that need the parking the most.

A full costing of implementation and annual running of this proposal, including kingfisher and ANY other mitigating proposals, such as compensation for traders lack reduction of business, must be

These charges seem like a ploy to raise money for the council at the expense of local businesses and local residents.

Secure carpark costs not affordable – Costs to put barriers up to stop unauthorised parking would be too high for TMP to fund

Shared Building - Building is rented, with other tenants, will be difficult to arrange suitable parking arrangement for all.

Impact on Staff:

Costs will not be affordable – Staff will have extortionate increased costs. Many work long shifts, 10+ hours, 4-5 days per week so will incur maximum daily charges

Retention – We may lose staff

Recruitment - Will be difficult for us to recruit new staff

Wellbeing - This is already causing anxiety for some staff

Morale – This will greatly lower staff morale

Parking will be a major problem – Limited or no space. Our staff use the free carpark in Martin square so our patients have priority for our small free carpark. With our staff not using the overspill free carpark in Martin Square, they will be forced to use our carpark (assuming the carpark isn't already filled by non visitors to TMP) leaving no parking for patients, visitors. Alternatively staff will have to park in local roads.

Safety concerns – Staff having to walk alone, longer distances to cars parked in side, unlit areas when dark

Impact on Patients:

TMP small carpark is not big enough – We have almost 15,000 patients registered with us and our patients need the additional free overspill carpark. Our own carpark is no where near big enough to support the daily parking needs

Costs will not be affordable – Many patients have to visit more than once a week. Lots of patients on low or no income

Personal healthcare will suffer – High risk that patients may put off visiting for essential and routine healthcare

Wellbeing – Many patients are already anxious / unwell prior to visiting, the worry of not knowing if they will find a free space in our small carpark or if they will have to pay could significantly increase anxiety levels even more.

Parking will be a major problem – Limited or no space. Assuming the carpark isn't already filled by non visitors to TMP or staff. Alternatively patients will have to park in local roads

Safety will be compromised – Patients may end up having to park in surrounding side roads, this is not suitable for those less mobile or those feeling too unwell to walk too far. Concerns for those walking alone, longer distances to cars parked in side, unlit areas when dark

Patient accessibility compromised – Easy access / parking is an essential requirement for a healthcare setting

Knowing that doctors can run behind by up to an hour it would be unfair to charge for time where the fault is not with the patients (not with the GPs/ nurses either - it's just busy). Also, there is always a wait at the pharmacy for prescriptions and this also needs to be taken into account. I have had to wait in there sometimes for 45 - 60 minutes and have sometimes been asked to return later in the day.

As for resident parking: It is unfair to charge these families for parking where they live. I don't know of any other residence where a family would be charged to park outside their home within the local area- whether that is The Birds Estate or the Trees Estate or anywhere else. Provide a permit so they can park safely but they should not be charged.

This is a community based area which would, I would have thought, been financially managed by the taxes we pay - private individuals and the local businesses? These costs are increasing yearly. To subject residents or those who are using the Medical Centre or providing support to the local shops to pay for these facilities twice is wrong and unfair.

I am lucky in that the shops and GP centre are within walking distance of my home - but not everyone is that lucky. The GP surgery covers a wide area and it is not possible for everyone to access them, especially if unwell, elderly or have babies and young children.

I therefore strongly oppose any introduction of charges.

Our customers signed a petition which was made available to you when this first arose showing all but one person would not use the shop if this came to fruition.

The Hospice is an amazing local charity based in Aylesford helping dying people and their families during a terrible and traumatic time. To diminish their income would be cruel and unacceptable within the local community, especially those who have or, may have to in the future, use this amazing and much needed Hospice. Feelings are very strong regarding this.

As the parking area for the medical practice in Martin Square is very restricted people need to park in the main car park so they can attend their appointments. If you inflict charges on the main car park you will be making patients to the practice pay to attend their appointments and also pay to collect their medications. Many frail and elderly people do not have the ability to walk very far.

- Malling PCN employ around 30 members of staff who work from or access the health centre as part of their day to day roles. Recruitment in healthcare, like many industries is difficult at the moment and small factors such as paying to park can be a barrier.
- Healthcare is still recovering from a pandemic, trying to regain routine for patients and get up to date with chronic disease management. There are still patients that do not want to come in to surgeries with the risk of covid, many do not want to bother their doctor because they know the strain that they are under and many are struggling to make ends meet themselves and cannot afford time out of work to attend the doctors. Adding parking charges into those considerations when attending a healthcare appointment is a further barrier.
- The PCN have put a lot of time, effort and investment into re-engaging patients with healthcare services since the pandemic as many people were not attending their appointment or wanting to come and receive help. This has a huge detrimental impact on their health and later on, will become a much greater cost on the healthcare service.
- Healthcare staff already receive a lot of abuse and opposition because people struggle to get an appointment and due to the nature of healthcare, appointments can be delayed. We do the very best we can with what we have but sometimes with a shortage of staff and simply giving those that need it more time, we inevitably run behind. For those visiting appointments within a charging time,

I have no doubt that running over their parking time will be another grievance received by our hard working reception teams.

- It was raised that currently parking areas in Tonbridge, Borough Green and one other location cover parking costs across the borough of Tonbridge and Malling. It sounds like these are the more affluent areas of our borough. In healthcare, we also have to make provision for the varying levels of deprivation across our patch and have to make a similar decision that funds are not split fairly because it makes sense and allows us to address need. It doesn't seem unreasonable for this approach to be the same for parking.
- Everyone is aware that the NHS is struggling. Like all businesses, we are also trying to find alternative and innovative ways to help more people with the limited funds and resources we have. The current set up with free parking in Martin Square is allowing us to do this at present with 4 car park spaces in our health centre car park occupied by the 3 trailers and a hub accessible with plentiful and free parking for people from all across the local area. The services we are providing are in addition to GP services and were created because of high need and demand at a local level. If parking charges were imposed, we may be forced to remove the trailers as spaces will be needed for staff or patients and entire healthcare services will be lost.

- 2. Despite plenty of choice in the local area, my family use Tapers Hairdressing and Tapers Beauty regularly. Some treatments can take over 2+ hours which adds an additional cost which we can (and others) ill afford. This will deter people from using these lovely salons.
- 3. Staff working in the stores will be paid minimum wages so won't be afford to work in the stores due to charges.

4. Parents utilise the car park to park while dropping their children at Lunsford and Brookfield schools. Introducing charges will mean that parents will park in the surrounding roads causing dangerous obstructions and potentially leading to an increase in RTA.

I propose that you introduce a system which enables the first 3 hours parking for free and thereafter charge from 3 hours onwards for residents only. Shop workers should be able to park for free. This would stop the "low turnover" which is caused primarily by residents in the flats around the square.

I have never had difficult in finding a car parking space in the 20+ years I have lived in the local area.

Parking charges will act as a barrier to accessing medical services at the heath centre and accessing education at the library: creating increased congestion on the local roads and taking away a safe dropping off point for our children attending the local primary schools.

Living within the Borough and so a council tax payer I object that to introduce charges to a car park that has always been free, will involve spending taxpayers money putting in infrastructure and increasing enforcement capacity.

Martin Square was built in 1960's with a car park to serve the 20 council owned shop units and the residents in the council maisonettes above the shops. These are local shops that serve local people. Local shops do not normally have charging put on car parking. Our existing customers will be able to travel to competing traders eg Mid Kent Shopping Centre, Aylesford RP, Morrisons, Tesco, Lidl, Kings Hill all who currently offer free parking.

Rent is paid by traders to the council estimated at £10,000 per unit giving an income to the council of over £200,000. The maisonettes also bring in income to the council. Empty shops bring in no income to the council.

The car park is popular, but as a recent survey showed rarely completely full.

MS is successful, represents the heart of the community having a post office, pharmacy, large medical centre and library.

Traders in Martin Square are large employers, whose employees require the use of the car park. The pharmacy alone has over twenty employees. The car park is also extensively use by health care professionals working at the health centre and Primary Care Network. They can choose to work elsewhere!

The charity shop relies on volunteers, many of whom are elderly with restricted mobility requiring parking facilities, services valuable for the community but also for the volunteers well-being.

MS has attracted a butcher to open in January 23, after an absence of 15 years 'bucking the trend' of local shops closing.

MS is adjacent to Brookfield Primary School, Brookfield Junior School and Lunsford Primary School collectively with a capacity of 646 pupils and is frequently used by parents on the school run, to safely cross a busy road.

Parking charges will in inevitability displace vehicles placing strain onto local roads. The majority of terraced houses on the main Kingfisher Road do not have access to off road parking,

It will be impossible for parents to be able to afford to do this if the proposed charges come into play. With a child with SEN this process could be 10 minutes or half hour. Nightmare to predict costs. Parking in streets is bad enough around Larkfield without pushing all those who would use Martin Square previously onto them. What about the safety of the children in our schools? Similarly for patients visiting the Doctors. There is limited parking available in their designated car park so naturally you use the main one. Even with queuing at the chemist you are not going to know how much parking is going to cost. My elderly Mum with mobility issues is going to find it very difficult and expensive to be able to do either of those visits. I get that some folk may misuse the longer stay facility but why not extend the limit for free parking? What happens for those who live and work in the Square? A sudden penalty for doing so. If every one has to consider the cost of parking on top of what they were planning to spend in their shopping it is going to be easy for them not to bother. I would certainly think twice now about going so often if it's almost a surcharge on my takeout for example. Some of those businesses have served this area for a long time and it would be a great shame for them to suffer in an already difficult climate. What about the butcher's as a new enterprise, now wondering what the future holds? Larkfield is very blessed to still have a library and whilst it still has its own car park, there isn't often space for more than 4 cars in there. No parking there means using the main car park, at a proposed cost. We use the Library on a very regular basis and would hate to see that change due to the proposed charges. Not only will shops suffer but the ability for people to access books and computers etc will have a knock on effect. The Larkfield Community Group have successfully used the car park for their Christmas light up Larkfield event and how sad to hear them say that it could end due to the changes. In this current climate we should be supporting local communities, businesses and livelihoods, not destroying them with decisions made by those not living in and with them on a daily basis. If changes have to come into play and/or charges have a proper look at what is happening here. Sadly most will feel our voices are not worth raising for such issues nor possibly have the ability to complete forms like this online.

In addition, nearby there are primary schools and a nursery. Visits to most of these services are brief and parking needs of limited duration.

The parking area is high turnover, with the exception of residents and business employees, and is seldom full. The proposal to introduce parking charges states 'the car park suffers from low turnover long-stay parking', therefore a better alternative to eradicate this and still meet local needs is to introduce parking charges after an hour and allow the first hour as free.

Residents and local business employees should be granted a free parking permit. Season tickets can be made available to those, not associated with local homes or businesses, who need long term parking in Martin Square. This would allow most visits to be charge free and particularly help those who are older or less mobile. The charge free period will preserve the easy access to local services and enable local businesses to survive.

The proposal to introduce charges on entry fails to take account of the impact of additional parking on local streets - already congested - and on alternatives such as the areas outside the health centre and library and in Morrisons nearby. The buses struggle to negotiate Kingfisher Road currently and the situation will only be aggravated by the implementation of the proposal as short term visitors to the Square will look to avoid paying 60p.

There is little dispute of the need for local councils to raise income in these difficult times but to achieve the stated aim of the proposal of reducing low turnover long stay parking and maintain the strength and purpose of the centre of Larkfield, the sensible option is an initial charge free period.

Let's embrace the community and try to support our businesses and not completely ruin the area.

Has anyone thought of introducing a receipt scheme where if there are charges, shoppers can use their shop receipt as proof of purchase for access in and out of the car park? A QR code or whatever? This system is used widely in other places across the UK. If charges are going to be introduced surely this would be the best and fairest way to ensure that actual business users are parking their cars in the car park for the correct use.

There are a lot of shoppers that only park for 30-60mins (say a maximum of 60mins) for the post office and the butchers.

Then there are some parking longer to use the hair salon for example.

But these are all there to justifiably use the businesses.

Perhaps there could be a maximum stay of 60mins via vehicle number plate recognition and for the businesses such as the hair and beauty salon which may require longer, they have the receipt/proof of purchase system for just them?

The half hour free policy or the first hour free policy would help those people who use the cafe to eat ( although just the first half hour only might give them indigestion ). The first hour policy would also especially help patients to Thornhills Doctors Surgery as the parking spaces provided for the surgery are inadequate and often patients have to park on the Square itself. The free period would also be helpful to those who need to join the usual long time consuming queue to pick up prescription medicine from Paydens Chemists, often after an inordiately long wait at the Surgery.

You might also consider providing more spaces for disabled driver parking. Not necessarily totally free but a better provision.By adopting these measures you could:

- 1. Raise some money.
- 2. Help keep Martin Square shops in business by not scaring away the shoppers.
- 3. Prevent much long term parking thereby stimulating vehicle movement and revenue from those who do need to park for longer periods.
- 4. Help to make local people think that you are not always totally against them and thus gain a bit of kudos for a change.
- 5. Consider recovering any revenue lost by this mitigation of charges by putting up the Council Tax so sharing the financial burden. After all, you are going to do that anyway, are you not?

Introducing charges will deter visitors to the plaza cafe which currently has good custom and those patrons never struggle to park.

Charges will also lead to less people visiting the library as that has very limited parking. My objections to the proposed introduction of car parking charges in Martin Square are a

follows. The car park, as you are aware is a free car park, with parking for 23 hours within 24 hours.

It is used by the residents of the properties surrounding Martin Square who have no other options but to park in this car park; for those who work in the businesses in Martin Square; also those visiting the shops and facilities in Martin Square have no option but to park there. The businesses in the square contain not only hairdressers, charity shop, butchers, various take away food shops and betting shop which are well used by local people. It is includes Post office/newsagents, Pharmacy, Doctors Surgery, and Library, these being used not only by Larkfield residents but by a much wider community, as they are their nearest facility for these needs.

The introduction of parking charges would have a great effect on all those working in and customers of the facilities provided, and causing hardship to many. Those that have no alternative to using the facilities provided or who wish to still support these facilities will be penalised and those that have an alternative would stop coming to use these facilities. Also how to know how long you will need to park to attend the doctors surgery or the pharmacy and post office, at which there are frequently long ques. The Library is also well used and has not only its books but computer facilities, how long to judge the time for this use - the KCC is always looking to close this facility, you will be helping them to do this. Some of the businesses in the Square may have to close because staff cannot afford to pay for parking, what about the Heart of Kent Hospice shop where people give their time free but will now be required to pay for parking?

Please re-consider and do not bring in parking charges for this car park.

### Off-street response – Reference number 3223

I support parking charges.

Once again, I've reviewed your intention of introducing Parking Charges at the Martin Square Car Park.

Although I support the proposal, I don't support the proposed Scale of Charges. As a Larkfield resident for over 35 years let me explain why.

As residents of Larkfield, living between the M20 and Leybourne Lakes, when we moved to this area in the 1980's we enjoyed having a local Post Office/Newsagent in the Tesco precinct. Sadly, this facility was closed shortly afterwards and since then we have all had to go to Martin's Square for our Post Office requirements.

Regrettably (annoyingly!), in the last few years, when visiting the Post Office, it has become more and more difficult to find a parking space. Almost certainly, more and more people are parking here during the day, because it's "free". I'm a frequent visitor and some days I'm waiting more than 10 minutes for a space to become available. My neighbours have also expressed their constant frustration of trying to park in Martin's Square. Hence, the reason I support the proposed change.

What I am strongly against, however, is your proposed Scale of Charges. This is an extremely busy Post Office, serving all the residents of Larkfield (especially with the increased number queuing with parcels to send!!) and, many times, the waiting time to be served is in excess of 20 to 30 minutes. Hence, my proposal is you apply your Scale of Charges but with the 1st Hour "free". As well as going to the Post Office, this will then also enable other shops in the precinct to be visited (such as the Pharmacy) within the one hour free time slot. After the 1st Hour "free" you could then charge £1.50 from 1 to 2 hours to recover your lost revenue. Am sure this proposal would also be welcomed by Shop owners in the Square, as well as visitors/patients to the Medical Centre.

Finally, but just as importantly, what you must also consider is if Parking Charges are introduced from "time of arrival" in Martin Square, then more and more visitors will go and park next door in Morrisons "free" Car Park.

Am sure Morrisons will then quickly get upset and would also need to take corrective action.

Parking charges in Martin Square Larkfield? It's outrageous!! I've never had a problem finding a parking space there. Most people go there to access the medical centre, the pharmacy and the post office. Why are you going to charge them for that? If you don't want people to park there all day, limit the parking time, but please don't charge people. We are all having a bad enough time of it as it is with the cost of living and just about managing to get by without you adding more costs on top.

I do not agree with your proposal. Of course you won't listen to the likes of us, it will go ahead anyway but I thought you might as well know how we feel about it.

I'm writing to say that both my wife and myself are against the introduction of charges in West Malling high street and Martin Square. We believe that both will cause a significant drop in the footfall in both areas as there are plenty of alternative options (why use Tesco WM if the addition charge would mean it's cheaper to use Tesco Lunsford Park, why use the chemist if it's more economic to use the pharmacy in Tesco Lunsford Park etc?).

If ultimately a charge is introduced it would be beneficial to local businesses if the first 30 or 60 minutes were to be free. There are plenty of examples across the country where the introduction of charges has resulted in the loss of "high street" businesses.

The likely short term gain will result in long term pain ultimately reducing parking charge revenue and, in all likelihood, less business rate income for the council.

Similar arguements apply to the situation in Martin Square.

My visits are usually the "pop in type" lasting less than half an hour to an hour but often at least three times per week. I believe that to impose parking charges will have a huge impact on these small businesses.

- 2)Parents call in to the Square shops after dropping children off to the primary schools nearby or after school but would not want the burden and hassle of paying every time.
- 3)The chemist and doctors surgery are a vital facility and a lot of people just pop into the library.
- 4) The charity shop which supports the local hospice needs people to be able to drop off donations and parking for its unpaid volunteers.

If the council wants to stop all day parking perhaps they should impose charges after 3 hours. I don't think you can compare a small local access facility with a town like West Malling.

I know there is a lot of opposition to these proposals and I hope people's views will be taken into account .
