We are at the moment in the midst of a cost of living crisis and in effect TMBC will be imposing a parking 'tax' on residents in order to recover money to bolster their budget. This is no fault of TMBC, but the Council should be lobbying national Government for additional funding - not charging its own residents in order to increase lost finances.

The car park is also used by those wishing to travel by train from Aylesford train station, as the station has extremely limited parking available. This would be an additional cost to those train customers, and the charge of £5.80 per day is far higher than station car parking at comparable stations (ie Snodland).

An improved way to prevent long-term parking would be to provide parking permits to residents and local businesses, and to allow free short-term parking of up to 3 hours, charges applying thereafter - but those charges being reasonable, for example max £3.50 per day. This would allow occasional use of the car park (for example people visiting shops and businesses and accessing the allotments), it



would be a minimal cost to those who have no choice but to park here (ie residents) but would deter other long term parking.

In addition to the local school the church only has space for 6 cars, and due to location it the surrounding roads are all double yellow lines, so at funerals and other events the car park aids guests for these.

Alongside the school and church, local business would see an impact on trade and causing a downturn in income and potentially further closed businesses. The village has already lost the little cafe as guests visiting expressed parking difficulties stopped them going on a regular basis and if a cost for the car parks had been added the business would have had to close much sooner and local residents are already feeling the pinch.

An increase in parking would have a huge benefit to the local area, but added parking charges would be detrimental to the school, church and local business!

- I am not directly affected by the proposed charges but fear that there is bound to be a knock on effect to Medway Court where I live. Parking in Medway Court is already on a knife edge thanks to a previous Labour government who decided to carry out a program of social engineering in the form of forcing developers to provide the minimum amount of parking and it would force home owners out of cars. The result is too few parking spaces, as unless you live in London, not having a car or two, is not an option.
- The entrance to Medway Court is already often restricted due to people parking at the entrance as they are too lazy to use the village car parks which are currently free.
- The centre of Aylesford is as lovely, quaint, old village from a time when the motor vehicle wasn't even invented. Therefore space to park a car wasn't an issue. My personal view is that it is very unfair on current residents to now impose a parking fee, especially given that the knock on effect to the village is highly detrimental. Trade will be driven away as the car parks are already far enough away for some businesses e.g the Chequers PH, to add a fee to park and not even close by on top, would be rubbing salt into wounds. Most customers who park in the village to use the current businesses will probably drive somewhere else where the parking is free. That's my view about Maidstone town centre, when Bluewater isn't that far away and the parking is free.
- It's highly likely that residents in Aylesford with no parking won't want to pay for a permit. They will find the nearest space where parking is free: Medway Court and Forstal Road. Forstal Road is a nightmare when there is a sports tournament on at the weekend; do TMBC want to impose this on us 24/7? An opportunity was lost when the new floodlit football pitch was constructed which must have cost several hundred thousand pounds but only a handful of parking spaces were incorporated.
- Has anyone fully costed the installation of parking meters and almost 24/7 enforcement? Will TMBC actually make any money at the expense of destroying village life? It is highly likely that the village will die.
- Paid for parking in Aylesford is a totally unacceptable proposition and should be reserved for areas which have an existing parking problem – there isn't as far as I'm aware, any current parking problem in Aylesford village.
- I'd rather the cost was shared over the borough with modest increase in council tax than introduce parking charges in the village.

My response to the council's proposals is limited to the introduction of charges at the Bailey Bridge car parks in Aylesford, as these are the only aspect which will impinge on the operation of the school and the community in which we are located.

I fully understand the need for TMBC to consider this move in order to address the funding issues which currently blight it and all public bodies. I believe that the council has to pay quite considerable rates on the car parks, which is no doubt a drain on already limited funds. Hence, I can see why this move is being proposed. However, I would like to make councillors aware of certain issues, particular to Aylesford, which complicate the introduction of charges in the Bailey Bridge car parks.

Firstly, it will seriously impinge on the operation of the school. St Peter's is a tiny, historic school, on a magical site, but we have no car park, and absolutely no capacity to develop one. Our buildings are sandwiched between two extremely narrow roads, the first of which is one way, the second a cul de sac. The residents of the former have limited on road parking outside their older, historic properties,



whilst those on the latter have modern houses with driveways. Hence, school staff are not able to park on the roads around the school.

The vicar kindly allows staff park in her driveway, which runs alongside one of our buildings, and also allows us to use the church car park unless there is a service planned for the day. We are able to park approximately 7 cars in her driveway, and when there is no funeral etc in the church, we can also park another 4 cars at the church. We try to leave 3-4 spaces in the church car park to accommodate visitors and those who clean and support the church. However, all of my remaining staff park in the car parks in the village. I do myself. We probably have 6-7 staff parking in your car parks daily, and this increases when the church car park is closed to us.

St Peter's is a very happy, successful school, with low staff turnover. This benefits our children enormously. However, my ability to attract and retain high quality staff would undoubtedly be affected if they had to pay daily parking charges. The school budget is as pressured as that of the council and we could not afford to cover parking costs for staff. If you introduce parking charges, we would ask whether there would be some dispensation to allow school staff to use the car parks for free.

Secondly, a majority of families live within walking distance of the school, and walk to and from St Peter's every morning and afternoon. However, many also live beyond walking distance, or have parents who must drive on to work after dropping their children of a morning. They utilise the public car parks. If they are forced to pay in order to do so, I fear it will cause chaos around the school.

In my previous schools, parents would park on local roads, which was a nuisance, but no more than that. However, there are no public roads adjacent to the school where parents can park their cars. The historic nature of our village means that roads are simply not suited to on street parking. If parents are required to pay to park when dropping their children at school, a number will inevitably park illegally on local roads, which will cause a danger to my children. I can foresee chaos in the village every school day at 8.30am and 3pm if parents can not utilise the public car parks. If charges must be introduced, would consideration please be given to allowing a 30 minute grace period when people can park free of charge?

We all understand the need for councils to raise funds and to cut expenditure. However, if you feel obliged to introduce charges at the Aylesford car parks, I ask whether councillors would consider these measures in order not to adversely affect local residents and employees of the school.

My proposals are in line with the plan I put forward in 2021 when I represented Aylesford North and Walderslade on TMBC. Namely:

1. The West Car Park should be passed over to Aylesford Parish Council on a long lease, free of payment. In exchange, APC would undertake to pay the Business Rates and contribute to a "sinking fund" for ongoing repairs and maintenance. APC could cover this expenditure by imposing an annual fee of £150 (half what is presently proposed) and allocate residents a designated parking space. This income from permits would cover Business Rates and contribute around £5,000 pa to the sinking fund.
2. As part of the policing and the East Car Park, TMBC Enforcement Officers would also manage the West Car Park and issue tickets / collect revenue from drivers using the car park without the relevant permit.
3. A number of bays in West Car Park (perhaps 6) could be designated "visitor bays" for guests of residents who have no off street parking. This could be managed by a simple scratch card, purchased by the resident from APC, which visitors display in the window of their vehicle on the date of their visit. These visitor permits could also be used for tradespeople. They could be sold for a token charge of £2 to cover cost of production and generate additional revenue.

4. St Peter and St Paul's Primary School could issue parents with a permit allowing them to drop-off and pick-up children from the car park during designated times. This permit would not allow parking in the car park outside these times. The school could organise a "walking bus" to take children safely to school from the car park.

5. The East Car Park would be retained (and perhaps expanded) by TMBC and used by visitors to the village. I fully support the introduction of charges for the East Car Park as this will ensure people who use the car park for commuting (from Aylesford Railway Station), car sharing or workers from the trading estates made some financial contribution to the cost of maintaining the car park, whilst also providing additional income for TMBC.

I believe my proposals would address most of the concerns raised by residents and businesses

1. Residents would have a designated space to park at 50% of the planned cost
2. Parents could drop and collect their children without adding to congestion
3. Visitors and tradespeople would have somewhere to park
4. TMBC would be freed of the costs of the West Car Park, while collecting additional revenue from fines imposed on users not entitled to use it
5. TMBC would receive revenue from an extended East Car Park and visitors would pay their fair share of the costs to maintain the facility

I do hope the Council will seriously consider my counter-proposals which I believe would largely meet the council's objectives while maintaining the support of the wider community.

As a local resident and teacher at the village school, I am very concerned on many levels about the introduction of parking charges in these two car parks. Whilst I understand that, in general, things are becoming more expensive and that is the primary reason for introducing the charges, there are also aspects of Aylesford village that make it very unique to other areas and consequently, I believe careful consideration should be taken before introducing charges. Due to the ancient history of our village, very few houses have private, off-road parking. As a result, villagers have no choice but to use the village car parks to keep their cars and it seems unreasonable that they should now be charged to use this facility, whether a season ticket is available or not. The fact that the bus services have been so drastically cut in recent years means that residents have few other options for public transport opportunities, even if they only work in Maidstone. They need their cars to travel to work. There are few other parking locations within the village that are not car parks, such as along Rochester Road, the few bays in the High Street and further down Forstal Road alongside the park. Will these be charged too? How about the community centre? The impact there is likely to be significant as people look for ways to cheat the system.

Living in Medway Court, we already have a significant number of non-resident vehicles making use of our road as alternative parking for the village, whether they are visiting businesses, walking dogs, or simply taking photos of the old bridge. If parking charges are introduced in the village car park, we will certainly be over-run by more non-residents looking to avoid paying a parking fee. You will be aware that our road is very twisty and to have an excess of vehicles lining the street will cause it to become very dangerous for road users and pedestrians, particularly the many children who live in the road (including my own) as there are many blind corners. We see evidence of this issue on the few days when there are events at the recreation ground and the car parks are full, so this is not a comment based solely on assumption - it already happens.

Finally, from a teacher's perspective, having parking charges implemented that include both the beginning and end of the school day will cause chaos for the whole village. With the school situated at the top of a hill, we have few options for dismissing children safely and we already have some parents who take 'shortcuts' by trying to drop off and collect their children by car at the school gate down narrow Mount Pleasant or by lining Vicarage Close, which often leads to frustrated residents making contact with the school to complain about something that is entirely out of our control. Additionally, this can create a dangerous environment for our young children leaving and entering the school site, as they navigate road users. To implement charges in the village at these peak times would certainly intensify the risk to our children as it is inevitable that a large number of people will drive past the school to avoid parking charges, leading to a higher volume of traffic for those who are walking to navigate. It would almost certainly only be a matter of time before an accident would occur.

I sincerely hope that, if you decide to go ahead with parking charges, that you consider the impact it will have on ALL the residents and users of the village and not just those who abuse the facility of a free car park by leaving their vehicles there indefinitely.
