- 1. The free parking on Sunday attracts people from elsewhere, such as Tunbridge Wells to shop. If the charge is introduced the footfall into retail premises will decline, with the long term effect that businesses will fail, leading to worse retail opportunities for the local residents. There are more than enough empty retail premises in our High Street.
- 2. I am aware that the Angel Centre is the location chosen by two societies for their shows in the early part of the year. I know that free parking is essential for one of these shows, as they have traders who travel the length of the country to attend. Other visitors to these shows will also be put off if there is an additional cost for parking. The introduction of the parking charge could lead to these shows no longer being held, with no revenue for the Angel Centre. The visitors to these shows quite probably make use of the other retail opportunities in Tonbridge while here.
- 2.1 One option might be to introduce a free parking scheme for those attending events in the Angel Centre. I have seen these in use elsewhere. The vehicle holder enters his registration number in a terminal at the event, which is linked live with parking enforcement, so that they do not get fined. Typical example: Gillingham sports centre.
- 3. As the sports facilities in the Angel Centre are used after 1800, adding a parking charge is going to discourage regular membership. See 2.1 for an option.

I will use myself as an example: I use the Angel Centre gym three times a week. I tend to go after 18:00 and on Sundays (as do many others) and am afforded the benefit of free parking. I already pay a joint membership fee of approximately £850 a year. After parking, changing, using the facilities, and leaving I am there for around 90 minutes. This would require a two hour parking charge each time I visit. This would equate to approximately £400 a year. Almost a 50% increase in membership cost.

This will discourage me from using the facility. I will either swap to another (which is less money towards the running of the Council facility), or goes less frequently or not at all. If I reduce my hours of exercise my chances of becoming unwell increase and I present a welfare cost.

Thirdly: rather than just come up with ideas to generate additional revenue, the Council should provide proposals to save costs that equal the anticipated increase in income from the proposed increase charging periods.

The projected increase in funds should be clearly articulated against this change, along with the costs associated with implementing it (welfare and others, for example: overtime for traffic wardens to police the increased charging periods).

There appears to be no business case in the consultation documents I have reviewed. Please clearly publish and articulate the cost / benefit analysis of implementing this change. Please also include cost reduction alternatives.

Finally: I assume that as this proposal only includes Bank Holidays, that during other Public Holidays parking will still be free?

On 13 December, I wrote seeking the number of tickets issued in the West Malling High Street for vehicles staying for 30 mins, 1 hour, 2 hours or 3 hours from which one can see the effect of free car parking for 30 minutes or 1 hour would have on the other tariffs if the same financial outcome is required. I have not received any reply.

The consultation document also does not state the increased income expected for each proposal, which is necessary to judge between them.

Mary Portas recommended that market towns should have free parking to assist their viability. When car parking charges were introduced in West Malling, many lost footfall and had reduced income, some closing altogether. This reduced the business rate income to TMBC. This should be factored into the calculation.

It is not easy to follow this method of consultation. For example, the proposals for Ryarsh Lane cannot even be read as the writing is truncated, nor have I seen a series of questions about Ryarsh Lane. The consultation re Ryarsh Lane is thus flawed and should not be used as a basis for decision making.

I have also not been able to find a paper copy of the questionnaire which might have been easier to follow. In addition, I wanted to save my draft comments whilst I considered the matter further, but this hasn't been given as an option and doesn't seem possible. I feel that this method of consultation will therefore deter many from submitting their comments or result in incomplete responses.

As an example, we are very lucky to have an excellent choice of places to go out for a meal in Tonbridge and free parking certainly makes a difference when people are deciding where to go.

Another point made in the explanatory notes, is "There is also significant demand for parking on Sundays – not driven by free parking, but by the opportunity to carry out tasks, participate in leisure activities and attend events on what is for most a non-working day." Is this statement based on a survey of people using the car parks on a Sunday? Because without the data, this statement is invalid and therefore should not be considered. Although, if the council is using this an excuse to introduce Sunday charging, then that goes back to my original point, that the council want to discourage people from using Tonbridge centre businesses and amenities.

If there is great pressure on parking spaces, maybe the council should consider adding additional levels to some of the town centre car parks, as has been done in the car park at Tonbridge Railway Station.

The section of "Changes to car park charging periods" in which the changes for Ryarsh Lane are partially obliterated and illegible.

There is no place in the consultation document to indicate whether respondents support or object to the proposals for Ryarsh Lane.

According to Para 8.02 of TMBC's Constitution, the Report to the relevant Committee should, when recommending a decision, should evaluate realistic alternatives prior to decisions being taken. I would hope that the alternatives outlined in this submission will be considered.

Following the recent announcement regarding the future of the Angel Centre I am also aware that the Centre is operating at a deficit and surely the impact of increasing charges can only worsen this situation.

Could I also ask for clarification regarding this consultation. The notice in reception first appeared in reception between Christmas & New Year (I first noticed it on 30 Dec '23). The consultation period ends 7 Jan 24; which given this is a holiday period seems insufficient. I would also question why, given that the trust holds contact details for members there has not been an attempt to proactively advise and consult with members.

At very least it would seem fair and appropriate to give Angel Centre members a concession or a refund of the parking charge. Provision of Activity and Leisure Facilities are a vital part of our community and empower people to take ownership of their health and well-being, reducing potential impact and cost to society overall. I think TMBC recognise this, but pressures on finance should not be permitted to adversely affect the overall ambitions of the authority.

I wish to comment on the above, but firstly stress my disappointment that this consultation notice was posted at the busiest time of the year - the lead-up to Christmas and New Year preparations and activities - when the general public, in the main, just don't pause and notice things, most assuming that the pale cream notice near a parking machine is merely telling us of an increase in charges in the future. Only on close inspection is the whole case revealed. So many people I have spoke with this week were astounded to hear that the bottom part of the notice was something else entirely, so haven't responded.

As I don't have internet/email I cant tick boxes but my comments are as follows;

The proposed new area / swings adjacent (illegible) grandparents and visitors with children, it is also a "breath of fresh air", enhancing the entrance view to the castle itself with a wider green view.

Extending weekday charges to 8pm - long after shops are closed will impact those wishing to come into Tonbridge for choir meetings, WI meetings, Church meetings etc.

Extending the charges to include Sundays and traditional bank holidays will affect a) shops which benefit from the fact that people can wander freely and actually investigate the offerings of shops they never normally visit when they are rushing to accomplish targeted shopping before their parking ticket expires, and affect b) family life. At a time when the health authorities and local GPs are greatly concerned with the public's mental and physical health/well-being, the precious opportunity for a chance in busy lives to have freedom to "take your time" unhindered by normal restraints cannot be underrated. For the less able who cannot be rushed, the vulnerable and the disadvantaged families the benefit of this concession is immeasurable and needs to be recognised and acknowledged. Simple things, such as the opportunity to spend hours in the local park, enjoying a long stay using the play equipment, ball games on the playing field, stopping for a picnic etc, make a difference and help people cope when times are difficult.

c) Sunday worship - The simple act of worship in the several churches/chapels situated in the heart of Tonbridge will be affected - i.e. paying to attend church!

As many churchgoers I come in to Tonbridge centre for the morning family service and also the evening 6pm service. No doubt those worshippers who go to Holy Communion at 8am on a Sunday will face "overnight parking" charges as they need to arrive before 8am?

For the reasons I have stated, I strongly disagree with this form of money-making by the Council and urge you to re-consider an seek other ways to raise revenue.
