Not satisfied with the daytime businesses being affected, now it's the turn of the night time economy. More visitors will stay away until parking becomes free or charge at 8pm, or visit out of town areas where these restrictions do not apply. More empty units are inevitable.

Extending the charging period to 8.00 is the most short-sighted proposal of all. All it will do is increase the profits of operators who hire out private driveways.

Contentious and unpopular, this is a sure way to lose Council administration votes. Your intention is to penalise locals for parking for long periods to free up short-term places, but it is visitors who have no option but to use these and are thus discouraged. Only local people can walk, realistically use buses, and park outside their homes.

Despite time restrictions and charges becoming ever more onerous over more than half a century, there is little empirical evidence on their effects on parking duration. Evidence suggests parking demand being inelastic (Marsden, 2006, Pierce and Shoup, 2013). Evans (2005)

Parking Charge Proposals Martins Square (REDACTED)

We oppose the proposals to charge for parking in Martin Square because we are likely to face bankruptcy due to loss of clients and staff. The time spent by customers at our premises is proportionately longer than that for other businesses. For example, 50% of our clients visiting for hair colours and beauty treatments are with us for around 4 hours. It is therefore a significant charge to our clients in particular – clients making a short visit to the butcher or post office face a charge of 60p whereas 50% of our clientele face a charge of almost £4 and the other 50% at least £2.

By charging for parking, the Council is therefore indirectly increasing our prices, leaving us zero opportunity to increase our own prices in line with inflation. Like many businesses, our running costs have increased substantially, but due to the nature of our business, we are more affected than other businesses by the huge increases in gas and electricity because we have a greater need for hot water and to keep clients warm with wet hair or, in the beauty salon, where many clients need to remove clothing. We have already been 'swallowing' these additional costs for the past 18months.

Our margins are therefore already seriously compromised we cannot therefore afford any risk of loss of clients who are likely to use other salons where parking is free (eg Snodland).

We predict we will lose long-term and reliable staff, because they now have to pay parking charges, and because we cannot increase our prices (due to customers parking fees) we cannot increase wages. Our staff will therefore, in reality, and as a direct result of these parking fees, experience a wage cut. Our businesses operate in a market where recruitment of suitably qualified and experienced staff is already impossible. We will lose staff as a direct result of the financial restrictions imposed by parking fees in Martin Square (because they have to pay out large sums for parking, and we cannot afford to increase wages as a result of not being able to increase prices, which is a direct result of council parking fees). Council income increases through parking, and business profits reduce. Result = businesses closing down.

Our profit margins were already seriously compromised. If we cannot increase prices due to the council imposed parking charges, we run risk of folding two otherwise successful shops in Martin Square. The council therefore has a direct hand in the degradation of the commercial area in Martin Square, a place that is nowmore commercially viable than it has ever been. Whether long term in the Square like ourselves, or a newer investor like the Butchers shop, every one provides vital services which boost the local economy and community. Local people who have the opportunity to walk to the Square for local services, will likely experience all of these small businesses folding up one by one, negatively impacting their lives.

The decisions of business owners to start up in Martin Square, was taken on the basis that client and staff parking was free. The parking prices are so high for hair and beauty in particular, because the time customers spend with us on average, is up to 20 times higher than the other businesses in the Square, it is therefore, our clients who will be most disadvantaged by this. The knock-on effect on our ability to increase prices and wages in line with inflation will be hugely compromised to the extent we fear the loss of 30% of our clients and around 50% of our staff.

The Council talks of wanting to be fair. This scenario for Hairdressing and Beauty is not fair, due to the nature of our work. Staff parking season tickets also do not benefit our staff equally, because some work part time.

I'm writing to say that both my wife and myself are against the introduction of charges in West Malling high street and Martin Square. We believe that both will cause a significant drop in the footfall in both areas as there are plenty of alternative options (why use Tesco WM if the addition charge would mean it's cheaper to use Tesco Lunsford Park, why use the chemist if it's more economic to use the pharmacy in Tesco Lunsford Park etc?).

If ultimately a charge is introduced it would be beneficial to local businesses if the first 30 or 60 minutes were to be free. There are plenty of examples across the country where the introduction of charges has resulted in the loss of "high street" businesses.

The likely short term gain will result in long term pain ultimately reducing parking charge revenue and, in all likelihood, less business rate income for the council.

Thanks for your efforts to raise awareness of this consultation on NextDoor.

I replied with link to my own ND post which includes my alternative ideas, which I've also put in response to consultation. To explain: my proposal is based partly on the success of LB Hillingdon - where we lived for nearly 30 years. Some years ago they introduced a free, residents-only Hillingdon Card, which gave us 30m free on & off-street

parking, plus very preferential rates for longer periods. Over time it transformed the way people used their local shops, & encouraged new & diverse businesses to open & created more vibrant & popular high streets.

Hillingdon is predominantly suburban, with residential areas centred on neighbourhood shops - much like T&M. There were problems with access to & abuse of residential parking - even in streets 15-20m walk from Tube stations. Parking management schemes proliferated - as far as 40m walk from the Tube! (due to knock-on effect of PMCs). When the Hillingdon Card was introduced, this parking problem was largely solved overnight. When residents found they could stop off at their local shops easily & cheaply, without clogging up local streets - they did. Over the years, more shops & restaurants opened, due to the increased foo@all. More interesting shops, cafes & restaurants has in turn encouraged non-residents to come into the area - & they pay more for their parking. Some areas now have a very popular & vibrant evening environment. Of course - like everywhere - the pandemic did have an adverse effect but areas are gradually recovering.

Having a 'card' to achieve this may be too much for TMBC - not just cost of card but of new meters. And the 'local shop discount' additional benefits of the card were not very successful. But the same could be achieved with resident parking vouchers, for example. Buy a carnet of tickets, display 1 alone for short, free parking period, or together with a parking ticket to double (say) the parking time allowed.

If you price residents out of their local car parks - they do have other choices & will go elsewhere, with all the adverse effects stated in my post. These will be hard to reverse & their consequences will cost you even more money eg anti-social behaviour. But if you make it easier, not harder - your revenues will improve. You just have to have faith in your residents & businesses!
