The change is intended to:

- Reduce the time that available homes are void
- Make the Choice Based Lettings system work as efficiently as possible
- Improve the verification process of adverts in order to raise the quality of the information given to customers
- Simplify the advertising service for customers by removing the fortnightly cycles and advertising homes for a period of seven days

This change to our system could have a negative impact on those customers who currently rely on us to assist them with placing bids for available homes. We must consider how we convey the details of this change to our customers, ensuring that we do not exclude people with additional needs.

The change to our system means personalised property sheets will no longer be available.

The change to our system means coupon and automated telephone bids will no longer be accepted.

Kent Homechoice conducted a Kent-wide consultation in 2010 in which an overwhelming response was received to reduce the bidding cycle.

Continuous advertising of available homes has been piloted by Swale Borough Council and their stock transfer partner, Amicus Horizon, on behalf of the Kent Homechoice partnership.
