

Many of the addresses now have two vehicles and finding a space to park is getting worse. I work shifts and find it impossible to park down the road, and I have to park in other streets. Walking back to my home in the dark as a female is not something I like to do. I have noticed commercial vehicles working for the railway parked along the streets rather than in the empty station car park. I also notice people will park down May street rather than pay for parking at the station. Other issues I have noticed is down East street revive has parking bays placed that the cars block the junction and cars wanting to turn into east street from brook street, this makes it very difficult to use. We also have people from the industrial work places parking down our street, as well as those that do not live at May street who park cars that they are trading. If it was not for Smurfit Kappa allowing the use of the spaces on the May street side of their wall, parking would be a real issue that will over flow onto other streets. The anti-social behaviour that occurs due to the proximity of the station means many residents want to park in the street they live in so that as a street community, we look out for each other. Many residences would like to see permit parking. That allows a fair allocation to one per house hold and to include areas used for parking for those who have two vehicles. There is a large car park at the end of May street and by East street that seems to be used intermittently and is closed at night. Having a permit to park in there may help as many households have work vans too. As a council there needs to be consideration that parking is an issue for every street with house hold having more than one car. We are next to a big industrial park and we are inconvenienced by the volume of traffic /parking down the streets, such as I have mentioned before regarding the parking bays by revive. Surly to foster good relations something could be done regarding the car park? Is it a wasted space as it never seems to be used . Can residential parking be given to a part of it. We also have properties that are made into flats that multiply the number of vehicals.
