The request for paring changes in Chiltern Way came from the resident of the Chiltern Way), who has been chasing-up progress on a regular basis since her initial request in October 2021. Her latest "chase" is below, from 5th February 2025.

Dear Mr Bracey,

You will understand my utter disappointment and frustration, to put it mildly, that I have never received any response to my email to you dated the 26th July 2023. I presume that this might have been a communication oversight.

I emailed you on the 5th October 2021 regarding my serious concerns with parking in Chiltern Way and specifically on the bend of where I live. I shall not recount the issues which were raised at that time as you must already have them from my previous correspondence in this matter. They were also summarised in my letter of the 26th July 2023 I should like to add that the parking situation has deteriorated dramatically since then and Chiltern Way has in effect become an overflow car park for the surrounding area where stringent parking restrictions are already in place. It is high time that similar restrictions were introduced in Chiltern Way - a quiet residential area.

You kindly replied to my initial email in October 2021 and informed me about the procedures you have to go through to deal with parking issues. To quote you, you indicated that ".....to this end I have added this location to the onward "holding" list for the Parking Action Plan..."

This happened over three years ago and as yet I have had no communication whatsoever regarding the matters that I have raised.

I do realise that we are living in difficult times and as a doctor working in the NHS I am more than aware of this but waiting for a response after such a long period is, you will agree totally unacceptable.

I strongly advise a double yellow line on both bends of Chiltern way - Dernier road.

I should welcome your comments in this matter before considering what other options are available to me to expedite the unacceptable parking issues in Chiltern Way.

We have been responding to her incoming "chases" that it's on the list, and now its at the top of the list we are consulting on her request.

Ultimately, request for Chiltern Way echoes the Highway Code and so shouldn't affect those that follow the existing rules, but it is a low speed, low traffic volume area, where only one person has raised a concern about the issue. If the consultation indicates it is not wanted, then Members could comment to that effect.

In relation to Hildenborough, the restrictions are aimed at preventing the "free-for-all, park where you like" carnage that happens at school times. There was often parking on both sides of the road at the same time, in front of accesses and in the bus stops. The proposals maintain as much parking as possible whilst echoing the requirements of the Highway Code. The "school time" problems are not just 8-9am and 2:30-3:30pm, but also occur at lunchtime due to the nursery/playgroup that operates in the mornings.

Some school / nursery staff were also parking close to the school all day, so moving them further away (by having a non-pick-up and drop-off time restriction) would allow parent access closer to the school but staff have to walk a bit further.

I hope this assists in your understanding of the background to these proposals.

Sorry for the delay in coming back to you, Andy Bracey has been off on leave for half term (and today) and has been playing catch up so in terms of Chiltern Way I will ask him to send you a brief update when he returns.

As for Hildenborough parking review, this has been extremely slow in coming forward firstly due to Covid for completely changing the parking demand linked to commuting, forcing a redesign. This has also been affected by shifting views of residents.

I will again let Andy comment on the school drop off.

However, It is not unusual for parents to demand as much space irrespective of the Highway Code. When designing restrictions, we use the Highway Code to shape the proposals and to facilitate the most flexibility whilst keeping an eye on enforceability and practicality.

Because of the time invested in reviewing Hildenborough I suspect that many of our recommendations to JTB will be very much 'Members views are sought' to enable decision.



To whom it may concern,

I am contacting you to oppose the proposed changes for street parking at Chiltern Way.

I live at No. Dernier Road so am directly affected by the difficult parking situation.

Parking is already tight with far too many cars using limited space. Most houses have more than one car, which I understand is a sign of the times but it doesn't make the situation any easier. We have people from both ends of Dernier Road, Chiltern Way including the flats, Rowan Mews (that both have their own parking) and Shipbourne Road. I, for one, am never able to park outside my house as there is double yellow lines.

The double yellow lines outside my house have not been repainted in the 10 years I have been here. They are worn away and covered by a leaf mulch which has composted over them. Frequently there are 1 or 2 different people that then park there. If I catch them I make them aware as there have been times when wardens have issued tickets. The parking here is what makes access and exit difficult for Rowan Mews. It also means they block the dropped curb from the alleyway making it tricky for pushchairs and wheelchairs.

I am sure there will be many oppositions to the proposed lines. Especially one resident who it will affect the most by blocking their parking across a dropped curb (no driveway) outside their front door. Said resident has a driveway but inconveniently for them it is not by their front door!

More and more cars will subsequently park down Chiltern Way as space becomes even more scarce. The residents are already annoyed. I have been confronted several times over the years with complaints it's harder for them to get off driveways with cars parked either side. It potentially is an accident waiting to happen. At the moment, cars park on one side of Chiltern Way. With the new lines, I fear that cars will park on both sides making an awkward chicane which will be hard to navigate safely from either direction and also severely limiting access for dustbin lorries and even more importantly, for emergency vehicles.

I think a better idea would be to make parking bays to stop the "selfish" parkers from taking up more than a space or to have permits. Although I am aware the residential permits are normally zoned and so wouldn't necessarily stop people from surrounding roads parking in Dernier Road or Chiltern Way.

There is also an issue at the Yardley Park End of Chiltern Way with commuters for the station parking here for the day as it is the first road back up from the station without daytime restrictions.

I sincerely hope that my points, along with I'm presuming many other, are taken in to consideration before any drastic decision is made.

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

I have received your letters posted on my car and feel the need to respond.

Firstly, the spaces across the road are not parking spaces either. People are parking on the road as we do not all have driveways. Parking on the other side of the road, is in front of other people's houses, just like yours. I do not see any reason why you have any special right to refuse that people park in the road in front of your house.

I live about 120 metres down the road and very often must walk with arms full of groceries or bags to my house as there is no parking available close by.

As far as "parking on a bend" is concerned, as you know, cars always park on the bend on the other side of the road and this is indeed due to the lack of alternative parking available. It can be argued that this is more of a danger than parking on the bend in front of your house as cars also park on the other side of the road in that location and it is often difficult to pass through.


Whilst it is best not to park on both sides of the road, the road actually widens in front of your house and therefore does not cause an obstruction.

I assure you, if I had a choice, I would much rather live in a property with a driveway or park in front of my own house. Dear Sir/Madam

I am writing to formally object to the proposed installation of double yellow lines on Dernier and Chiltern Road.

Whilst I understand the need for traffic management and road safety, I believe this measure will have a significantly negative impact on local residents due to the already limited parking availability in the area.

I am a in Sevenoaks. Upon returning from work, the closest parking I can find is in Chiltern Road, at least 100 metres from my house. I then need to carry groceries, work bags etc to my house, often in adverse weather conditions.

Whilst I always try to park on the left side of Chiltern Way, cars are often parked three quarters down the road, which will make the walk to my home in excess of 150m. If this is the case, I will sometimes (very seldomly) park on the opposite side of the road where the road widens in front of 19 Chiltern Way.

Unfortunately, I have received a few unkind letters, which has prompted me to write the attached letter to the owner. I had a discussion with the police who assured me that I was entitled to park there.

Installing double yellow lines between Rowan Mews and Chiltern Way will further limit the parking options available and will only push the parking problem further up Chiltern Way, which will likely end up being parked up on both sides of the road.

Chiltern Way is no wider than the Dernier Road, and I therefore cannot see that there is any reason why installing double yellow lines between Rowan Mews and Chiltern Way (therefore moving double parking further up the road) will be beneficial to residents.

Indeed, I believe that this will only serve the purpose of inconveniencing the majority of residents, cause congestion in Chiltern Way and potentially cause safety issues by drivers

looking for scarce parking for the benefit of certain people (with driveways) who do not like to see cars parked in front of their houses.

Rather than implementing double yellow lines, I urge the council to consider alternative solutions such as resident parking permits to manage congestion without unduly affecting those who rely on local parking.

I hope the council will reconsider this proposal and explore options that balance traffic management with the needs of the community. I would appreciate being kept informed of any developments regarding this matter.

With reference to your letter of the 18th February 2025 although I am in favour of limited yellow double lines being introduced just on the corner of Chiltern Way and Dernier Road allowing the residents of No 19 to have unimpeded access to their property I do have serious reservations concerning parking in the whole area as a result.

The cars that currently park on the bends in question will inevitably be forced to park down Chiltern Way where there are already parking issues regarding access to household drives since there are no parking restrictions.

In addition matters are not helped at the entrance to Chiltern Way from Yardley Park Road. People who do not live in the road park their cars there as there are no parking restrictions as there have been introduced, for example, in the Haydens estate opposite.

Clearly there is a serious problem for parking in the area which needs to be addressed and I do appreciate that finding extra parking space in the area is to put it mildly difficult.

The 24 maisonettes/flats at the corner of the bend in question have their own parking spaces allocated in front of the homes where they live and in addition along Dernier road they have 24 allocated garages in a large compound. I have lived in Chiltern Way for many years and have never seen anyone put their car into a garage. I have however seen a garage open and full of junk. In addition the large parking outside the garage complex could perhaps be converted into a small car park which at the moment seems to be the home for a large Ford pick up and trailer. This area could be enlarged by reducing the width of the adjacent passage which leads to the Shipbourne Road.



Hope that my comments may be useful and I look forward to any public meeting if there is on envisaged.

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

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

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

I am largely in favour of the proposed changes to the on street parking with some amendments.

Whilst we agree in principle to double yellow lines - we feel that they are only necessary on the corners of Chiltern Way / Dernier Road. By putting them from No.26 up to Rowan Mews will only encourage further traffic to park in Chiltern Way. There is already a problem with inconsiderate parking from residents in Dernier, Shipbourne Road and Rowan Mews who don't allow sufficient space to enable residents to turn in / out of their driveways.

A further proposal would be to mark out parking areas down the road to insure that responsible parking is adhered to, and markers where driveways begin and end(as in Yardley Park Road). All of this then potentially creates a further issue of people parking on the other side of the road, thus creating a dangerous situation with nowhere to pull over when traffic is coming in both directions.

There is clearly a problem in this area with parking and by creating too many restrictions will only push the problem to other roads in the area.

We would fully support your proposal. Our property is situated on the area where the double yellow lines are being considered. The parking situation is currently a significant hazard. Not only when driving around the bend but also when moving out of our garage drive. As you can see from the attached pictures, our garage is located on the end of Chiltern Way and beginning of Dernier Road/ corner of Rowan Mews. With cars parked to the left of the garage on Chiltern Way, the view when leaving our drive or when coming out of Rowan Mews is partially blocked (both on the bend as well as next to the drive). This makes it very difficult to see oncoming vehicles or pedestrians (including school children) crossing the road. In addition, due to partially blocked views as well as cars parked on both sides of Chiltern Way, it is difficult for drivers entering the stretch of road between the bend on Chiltern Way and start of Dernier Road to see oncoming traffic. This frequently leads to vehicles entering the road at the same time from opposite directions, with one then having to reverse back out to let the other pass. These issues have increasingly been a significant hazard and led to a number of near collisions as it is frequently impossible to spot traffic.

As the double yellow lines would pass in front of our house, we would no longer be able to park on the dropped kerb in front of our property. This would mean that we would have to have an additional driveway built (accessed via the dropped kerb), as we could no longer park in front of our house. We are prepared to incur these costs considering the definite improvement in safety that the lines would deliver.

Since we have moved into the property in 2017 we have noticed a significant increase in cars being parked on Chiltern Way by residents of nearby properties, including Dernier Rd, Shipbourne Rd and Rowan Mews.


I refer to the above proposal of new double yellow lines on Chiltern Way/Dernier Road, near Rowan Mews. Whilst I would support measures to reduce the obstructive parking on the corner of this road, I have serious reservations about the "knock-on" effect that the double yellows would have on the rest of Chiltern Way.

There are an increasing number of cars being parked on Chiltern Way during the day, as workers seek to find free parking before walking to work in Tonbridge. Not only are the vehicles often parked in an obstructive way (there have been at least two occasions when access into and out of our drive was impeded by having a car parked closely either side of our drive entrance and another one parked on the opposite side of the road, across the entrance to our drive. Had we needed to use our car on those occasions, it would have been impossible to get out of our drive), there is a distinct lack of common sense being applied to the parking.

At the moment, residents of the road are managing because parking tends to be staggered between the two sides of the road; however, with parking further restricted, I fear that selfish motorists will simply park wherever there are no restrictions. This may well lead to parking on both sides of the road, in the same section. The consequence will be an extreme narrowing of the carriageway and restricted, if not eliminated, access to emergency vehicles and indeed to general Council vehicles, such as refuse collection.

The consideration of double yellow lines on the corner of Chiltern Way/Dernier Road needs to be discussed with strong consideration of the health and safety issues which could result if the rest of the road is left with no parking restrictions.
