I don't agree with the Borough Council proposal, I also feel it doesn't matter what we think, you just do what you want.

Also I think you should consider providing more parking space for the residents that live in West Street. I usually don't get home till 22.00 and 95% of the time I can't park outside or near my home. It's worse when we have icy conditions or snow, as residents from the lower part of the road park at the top of the hill, leaving nowhere left to park. There is a car park at the back of the bungalows of Mountain Close, which I feel that the residents should be parking there. Outside 38/40 is communal grass, I think would be best used for parking and parking allocated for 38/40 which would also leave a couple of visitors/ spare spaces. I was thinking of getting an electric car, but as I would be unable to park near my home 95% of the time.

I think if one of you lived here it would have been done sooner.

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Thank you for the chance to comment on this proposal.

I'm in favour of this definitely. As a resident of Bancroft rd the continues parking on the corner blocks all views getting in and out of our road and much over due.

I would suggest that it is extended down the hill and around the corner to the garage entrance on both sides of the road as the amount of vehicles that mount the kerb and park half on the footpaths are a daily occurrence on a blind corner that on a steep hill.

Also the yellow lines you did last year just up from us are constantly (all the time) parked on and need policing to be of any use. I foresee these new double yellow lines will also need to be police if you expect people to abide by the law.

Having noticed the lack of parking on the estate and the amount of vehicles parking on the footpaths, Bancroft rd is now being used as a free for all. Being that this close is for vulnerable elderly residents with minimal spaces let alone for carers and visits we could do with some more disabled parking bays. Having at least four residents with disabled badges and only one bay is coursing issue already. This will only get worse with the loss of three spaces under this proposal. In the carpark there is a space with dropped kerbs for a Ambulance ( a weekly event over the last few years ) this also could do with a emergency vehicle box put in. The slope of the carpark has coursed issues with transporting residents on a gurney from their home to the back of the ambulance.

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Good morning team, I would like to add to my last email after talking to my neighbours. We actually have five residents at the moment with disability badges not four that I previously mentioned.

Also the ten garages on Bancroft rd are owned and run by Clarion housing. Their lack of maintenance and refusal to rent out any garages to new tenants has left only 4 that can be used of which only one is a resident of Bancroft rd. so taking out 9 possible parking spaces. We have been in dealings with Wrotham parish council over the last five years to try and get this rectified but Clarion have no interest in renting out or maintaining the 126 garages on the estate. This alone is causing major parking issues everywhere, with some 40 residents vehicles parking on verges and footpaths around the estate.

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Dear Parking Team,

Thank you for your proposal. I am neither in favour or not, but do have an observation for the area which in question. Please survey the area at different times of day before making the change.

Parking is very limited, and there are often no free areas to park anywhere near this part of the estate. Whilst I see the benefit of this, there is no consideration for places TO park, only places they cannot. I am on the sloped corner [REDACTED] which is totally unsuitable for parking cars, however already see some there now, when other spots are taken. Please see photo [REDACTED] ... if the lines are to be drawn up, would it not be best to also extend to outside 57?

As part of this please consider allowing the rental of garages in the area again. Many of these lay vacant now, however Clarion refuse to allow locals to rent them. The rumours Mill warns of further housing, which would further exasperate the parking issues. Additionally, it would be very useful for all local residents to have a clear sign instructing who can park where and for how long. Due to limited parking, there are many disputes (and a significant amount of vehicle damage - punctured tires etc)...
